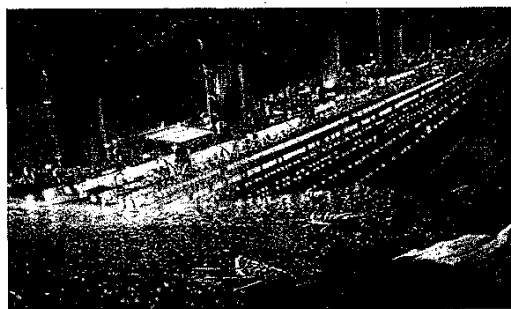

TERRORS OF THE TITANIC

Last night the titanic sadly sunk. It was the 14th of April 1912 that disaster struck on board the titanic. RMS titanic was carrying 2400 souls on board many of them died as the boat sadly hit an iceberg in the North Atlantic Ocean.

675 people are thought to have been rescued. But many people died by the coldness of the water after jumping in. Unfortunately distress signals were missed by the nearby ship as they believed they were having a party.



An expert from the white star line believes that the ship sank because the design was flawed. The bulkheads did not reach the top of the boat like it was supposed to as they ran out of money to compete the design. The white star line had many people contact them as they had many relatives worried.

The 'Unsinkable' Ship Has Sunk

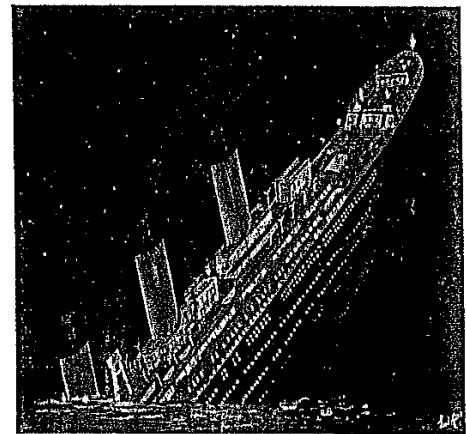
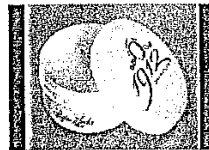
Last night, the RMS Titanic sadly sank, at 2:20am. Over 1,500 people were killed making it one of the most tragic events in modern history. After hitting an iceberg in the North Atlantic Ocean at 11:40pm the Titanic sank at a rapid speed.

The Titanic then began sending out distress signals to nearby ships, SS California. 675 people are thought to have been rescued by the RMS Carpathia at 2:20am.

A spokesman for the White Star Line told us "At 11:40pm the Titanic sent flares up into the air to get help, but the nearest ship, California, thought that they were having a party so did nothing to help."

Mr Jones, an expert on shipbuilding says that he thinks the Titanic did not supply enough lifeboats for every passenger on board. There were only 20 lifeboats which carried half the people on board. He also reported that the Bulkheads were too short and should have been built up high enough.
