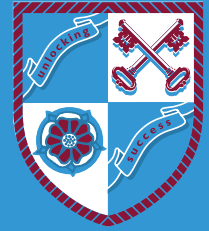

Warblington school appeared alongside Prime Minister Theresa May in the 2016/17 Parliamentary Review. Established by former minister The Rt Hon David Curry in 2010, The Parliamentary Review's September release is now a key fixture in the political calendar.

Across all policy areas, The Parliamentary Review is sent to over half a million leading policy makers. The articles in the Review act as both a blueprint for success and a template for reform.

The Prime Minister commented that 'this year's Parliamentary Review follows a significant year in British Politics' and this is reflected in the articles from leading journalists and best-practice representatives alike.

The PM's former cabinet colleague, Sir Eric Pickles, who was recently appointed Chairman of the Review, said 'it has never been more important for government to hear the views of business and the public sector in a constructive forum. It is also a vital time to share best practice and progress.'

The Parliamentary Review's director Daniel Yossman concurred, saying 'Warblington school and other hardworking organisations from across the country have come together to make this year's Review possible. 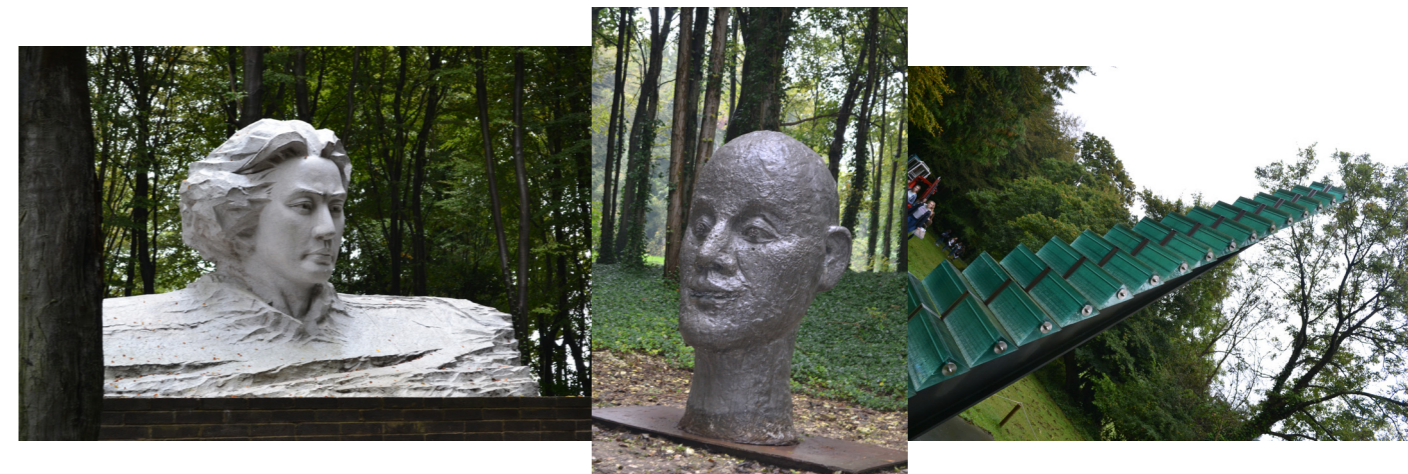
Goodwood Sculpture Park

About Tycoon in Schools

Tycoon in Schools is a free national enterprise competition, which aims to encourage the UK's budding entrepreneurs to get involved in business by giving them a start-up loan of between £50 and £1000 to run a business whilst at school or college.

Launched in 2012 by Peter Jones CBE and supported by the Department for Business, Innovation and Skills and referenced in Lord Young's 'Enterprise For All' review, Tycoon in Schools was developed as a direct response to repeated calls for a national enterprise challenge in schools. The competition allows students to start and run a business whilst at school or college, thereby allowing them to gain valuable hands-on experience of what is involved with running a business.

Club Launch

On Wednesday 27th September we launched Tycoon in Schools for Years 7 to 10. It's an enterprise competition where students design and run their own businesses. It was great to see representatives from every year group attend the launch and some amazing ideas were proposed. It was a brilliant start to the competition and I was looking forward to working with the students to create their business plans and see their ideas come to life!

The Tycoon businesses started trading on Monday 6th November and they were very excited about the prospect of selling their products to the students and staff of Warblington School. 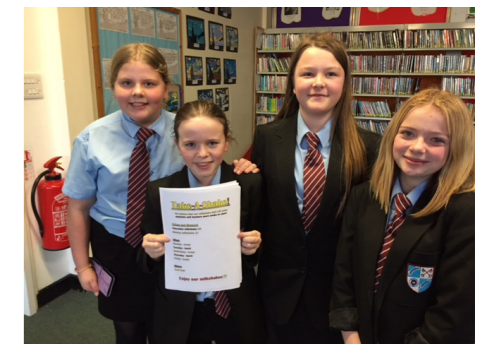

What is it like being in a school production?

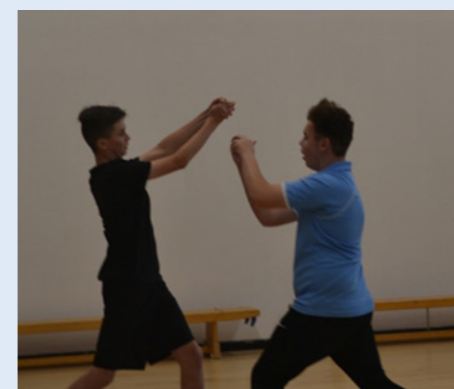
We have followed two of our Year 10 dancers in rehearsals and asked them how they feel about being in their third Warblington School production.

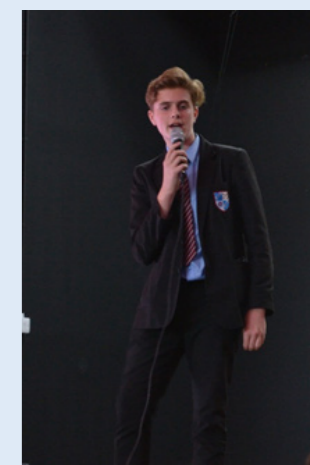
Charlie Byng 10F - *Being a dancer in the show is fun because I get to experience dancing on stage with my friends.*

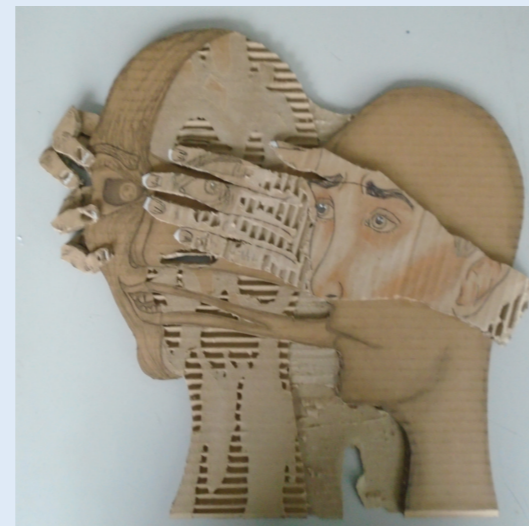

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
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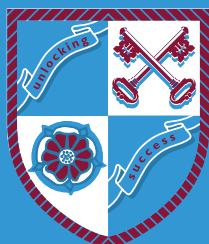
