## Lateness and Punctuality to School

Please be aware - If your child arrives late to school on three separate occasions over the course of one term, parents/carers will be invited into school to discuss the reasons for lateness. Support will be offered if appropriate. If support is declined and lateness absence continues with **up to 10** further episodes within 100 rolling day period, legal proceedings will begin which could result in a Penalty Notice being issued.

If your child is late to lessons twice in one week, this will result in a 15 minute same day detention. Any subsequent lateness will result in a 15 minute same day detention. You will be notified of this occurrence via Parentmail.

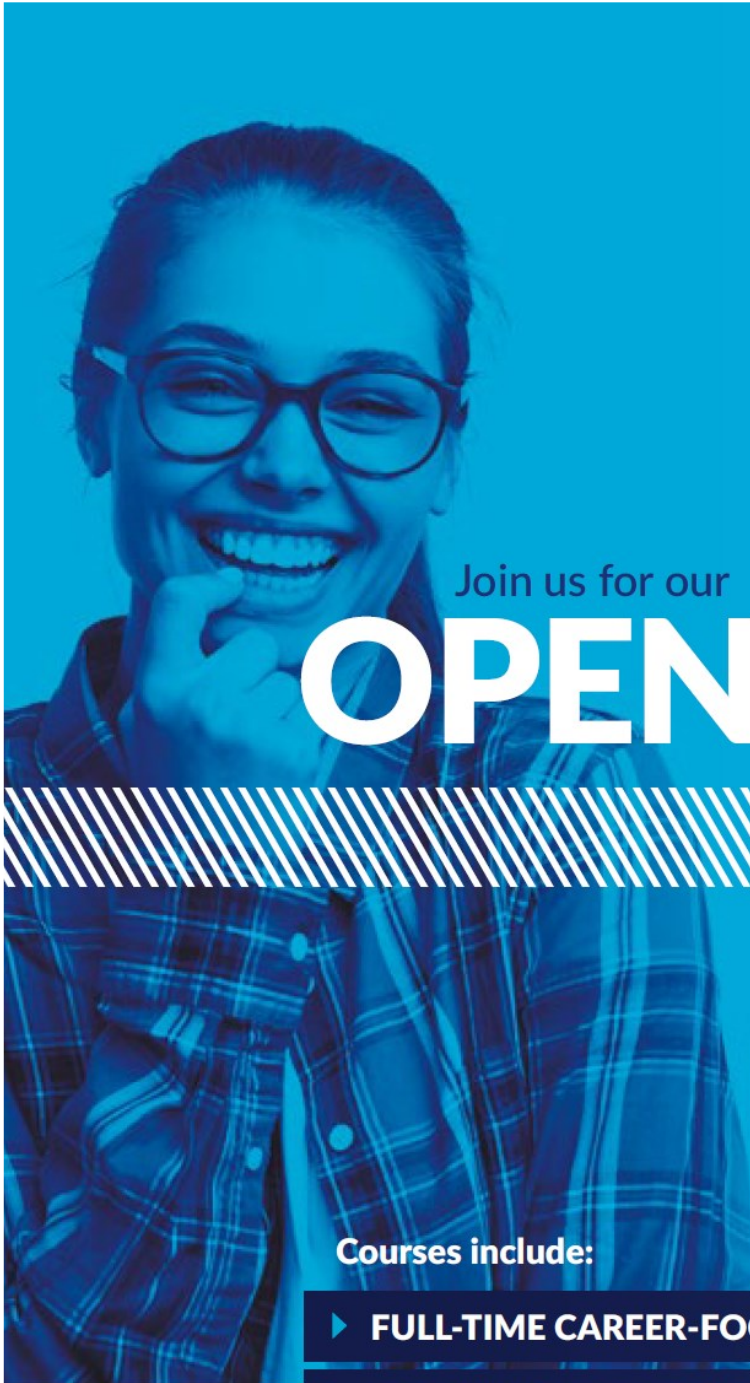
