Havant Youth Conference 2018

On Friday 23rd March, 8 students spent the day at the Havant Plaza attending the Havant Youth Conference. All the students enjoyed the day and the talks and activities on offer. They were brilliant ambassadors of the school in their behaviour and conduct and the way they listened and shared their ideas throughout the day.

More than 70 students were in attendance from 10 local secondary schools and they were joined by the Mayor, councillors and community groups for the Havant Borough. During the conference, guest speakers Keiran O'Toole, Dean Coady OBE and representatives from the Youth Commission delivered inspirational talks about anti-bullying, gang violence and positive choices. In addition, the students took part in interactive sessions about internet safety and the County Lines network before taking part in a question and answer session with local councillors.

A voting exercise also took place involving three different charities giving presentations on the work they do. The students had the chance to vote and decide which charity should gain a £2,500 grant from the council. Enable Ability and Off the Record jointly received the most votes sharing the first and second prizes totalling £3,500. They will each receive £1,750. Y Services was awarded the third prize of £500.

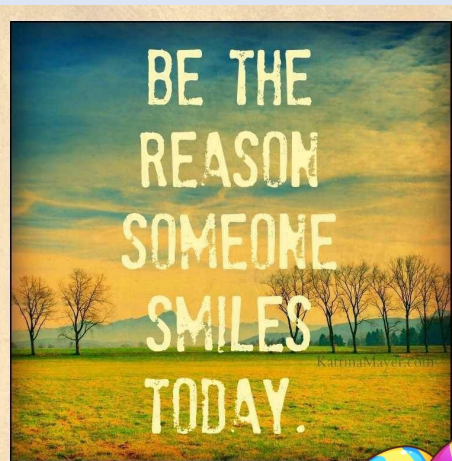

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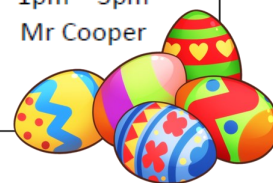

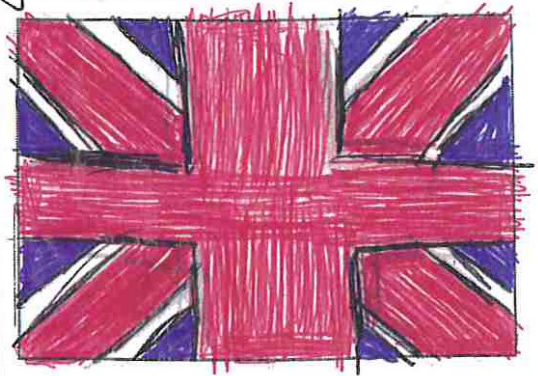
PM: Do your Duty and Support

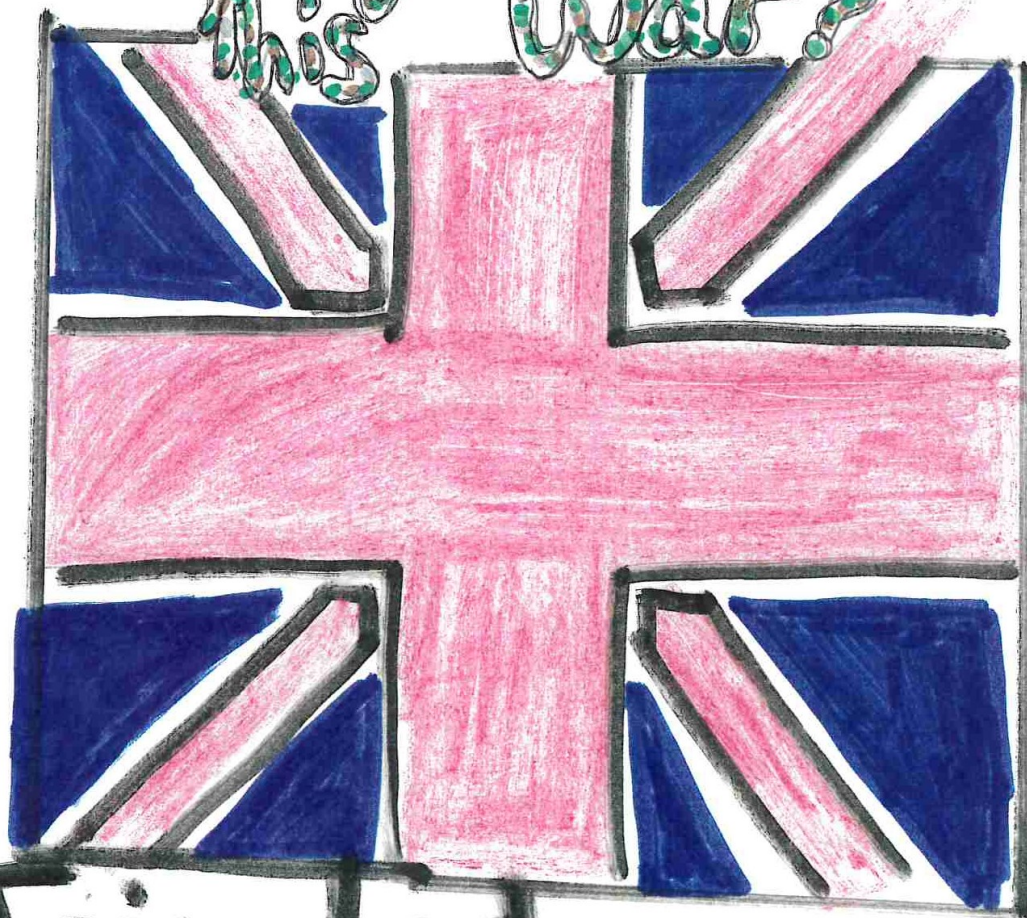

The Guide to the Great War!

The Assassination that started it all.

World war one started in June 1914, when a Serbian nationalist assassinated the Austrian-Hungarian Arch Duke Franz Ferdinand. On that same day Austria-Hungary had declared war on Serbia upon suspicion that the Serbian government having some involvement on the assassination. On July 31st, word got to Russia and Russia started mobilising their troops and called on the French to



do the same. Just a day after, Germany had already declared war on France and Russia and invaded Belgium August 3rd. This led to the Prime Minister of Britain David George, announcing that Britain was now at war with Germany on August 4th. By August 6th Austria, Germany had declared war on Russia leading to

Japan declaring war on Germany only 7 days after on August 13th. There were 2 sides of the great war, the triple alliance and the triple Entente.

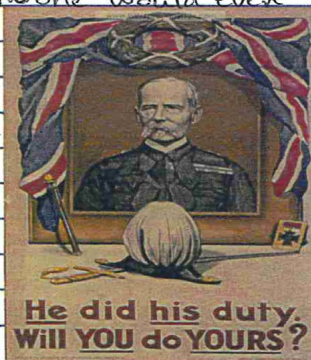
Be a Hero for your Country!
