Warblington School is a UNICEF Rights Respecting School. By reflecting on the United Nations Convention on the rights of the child and placing it at the heart of everything we do, we believe that our community is working together to enable our students to a take an active role in developing their place in society both now and as adults of the future (Articles 28 & 29).

#### Rationale

Students are required to wear uniform because:

- It makes them feel that they belong
- It removes pressures for fashionable and expensive dress from students and parents
- It is the easiest way of identifying sensible and practical clothing, suitable for School Life
- Wearing appropriate uniform is part of establishing Warblington School as a formal learning environment

#### **Aims**

All School Policies support the Whole School Aims, in particular this policy supports:

- To accept responsibility for ourselves and others
- To be confident and independent

All students at Warblington School are expected to wear the correct school uniform. Parents have expressed their support for distinctive clothing for Warblington students. Considerable effort is made to maintain standards of dress.

It is a strongly held view of the Governing Body that the school should follow a School Uniform Policy.

#### **Process and Implementation**

Skoolkit (1st Floor, Meridian Centre, Havant) sell all Warblington School uniform

All items of clothing should be clearly marked with the name of the student.

All Students: Black Blazer and School Badge (compulsory)

All Students: Mid-blue shirt, plain with collar **and top button** (compulsory)

( not denim or polo / T-shirt )

All Students V neck black jumper with blue stripe (optional)

(This is the only jumper that may be worn as part of school uniform)

All Students: Clip-on Tie (compulsory)

(please note only clip-on ties are sold at the uniform shop)

All Students: Sensible Black Shoes - no logos

Girls: Black knee length skirt

or Black school style trousers

(not jeans, cords, fashion or legging style)

Boys: Black school style trousers

(not jeans, cords or fashion styles)

### PE Kit - Girls and Boys

All students need the same PE kit to successfully take part in PE Lessons.

Light blue polo shirt

2 pairs black shorts (one for indoor; one for outdoor use)

Pair white ankle socks (indoor use)

Trainers - please ensure trainers are cleaned for indoor use (no plimsolls or Astro turf trainers)

Pair Light blue three-quarter length socks (outdoor use)

Boys only - Maroon rugby shirt (with white band)

Boys only - Studded boots

Dark Blue or Black tracksuit bottoms (optional)

It is worth reinforcing the fact that the School will also insist upon:

- Black shoes, not trainers
- No denim, or denim look alike to be worn as any item of clothing
- No baseball caps to be worn in school
- No unreasonable hair cuts or styles
- No false nails
- Jewellery is restricted to <u>one</u> pair of small ring / stud sleeper, not earrings and **no other piercing adornments** – whatever the latest fashion might be!

Jewellery is not allowed apart from a watch and one pair of ear studs. The School does not accept responsibility for the loss of jewellery or any other item which is brought to School against our advice.

Unacceptable items of jewellery will be confiscated, kept secure in the school safe and returned on Friday at 3.00pm.

## **Personal Appearance**

Students are expected to take a pride in their appearance, to be smart and properly dressed at all times.

Hair should be a sensible, natural style and colour. Coloured or dyed hair, braided hair with beads and shaved haircuts will not be accepted.

Body piercing is absolutely forbidden.
