Message from Mike Hartnell, Headteacher



Welcome Back!

It gives me great pleasure to introduce myself as the new headteacher of Warblington School. I feel very privileged to have been appointed by the governors to lead this school. Everyone has made me feel very welcome and have risen to the new challenges and meeting the high expectations we expect at Warblington. It's been a great first week and long may it continue!

I have previously worked as the Deputy Headteacher at The Henry Cort Community College in Fareham. This year is my 17th as a teacher, 8 of which I have held a role on the senior leadership team. I have, alongside this role, also been a Challenge Partner with the Local Authority which has allowed me to gain valuable experience in how to raise attainment and standards to ensure the young people in our care leave with not just qualifications but also the employability skills that are so sought after in a competitive job market.

I am looking forward to working with the whole community in moving Warblington to being the best school in the area. We have a committed staff and wonderful students which is a great place to start and I will be listening to the views of the students and parents as we move towards our goal. I believe that Warblington has many great strengths, many of which were highlighted in the recent Ofsted inspection, and the relationship between parents, staff and students is crucial to the success of the school. By working together, we can ensure that students not only enjoy their time at Warblington, but they also make good progress and leave us with the necessary skills, attitudes and qualifications to be successful in achieving their aims and ambitions. I have high expectations of the students and will continue to expect excellent behaviour, a positive attitude to learning and to arrive at school on time, ready to learn, wearing the correct school uniform.

In assemblies this week I have encouraged students to take pride in what they do in school. Uniform is a statement of pride in yourself, a statement of belonging and a personal commitment by the individual to the school. The exam results in the summer saw a dramatic increase in the number of students achieving the new GCSE results, with many achieving the coveted Grade 9. This give us a good platform with which to build from as all the changes to subjects begin to settle and embed.

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School Uniform Expectations


Please read below to clarify what Warblington School uniform should be to ensure that your son/daughter is in the correct uniform.

<u>Item</u>	Uniform Expectation	
Blazer	Black blazer with school badge	
Trousers	Black school style trousers (no jeans, denims, chinos, cords, combats, skinny fit or recent fashion trousers)	
Skirt	Smart, plain black skirt of <u>knee</u> length. These can be purchased from Skoolkit.	
Shirts	Mid-blue shirt, plain with collar and top button (no denim or polo shirt)	
Tie	Clip on tie	
Jumpers	School V neck black jumper with blue stripe. These can be purchased from Skoolkit.	
Shoes	Plain black shoes	
Jewellery	One small stud in each ear lobe	
Coats	All coats to have zip or buttons, <u>hoodies are not permitted</u> . School blazer <u>must</u> be worn under coat. Coats to be removed in classrooms.	

We believe firmly that if our students are smartly dressed in a uniform consistent with our school policy, they will be prepared for work in the classroom. Therefore staff are asked to monitor uniform on a regular basis and to contact home should concerns arise. If students should arrive in incorrect uniform following a staff phone call we will contact you again and ask you to bring in the correct uniform, as we know you will have ensured they have it following this guidance.

We are reminding you of our school requirements so that your child is able to comply with our basic non-negotiable expectations.


