WW1 Battlefields Tour 2018

During Half Term Molly McInnes 11A laid a wreath on the WWI battlefields on behalf of Warblington School.

On the weekend of the 3rd and 4th November, I went on a battlefield tour in Belgium. I went to many places such as Tyne Cot Cemetery which is the largest on the Western Front, Essex Farm and Menin Gate.

The trip was very moving and emotional because I saw lots of cemeteries and walked in the footsteps of the soldiers who fought for our country 100 years ago.

Day 1 of the battlefield tour was my most interesting day of the trip although it rained all day. I went to Essex Farm where John McCrae wrote the poem 'In Flanders Fields' and saw the graves of a 14 and a 15 year old boy who had lied about their ages to be able to fight for their King and Country but never came home again.

Day 2 in Belgium was very emotional because we went to Tyne Cot Cemetery and saw many graves. We also visited the visitor centre which had artefacts found in the surrounding fields. Artefacts are still being dug up today. Also while we were there I found my Great Great Grandfathers name on the Walls of Remembrance to those missing in action and I laid a poppy cross in his honour. Later that day we went to Menin Gate for the Sunset Ceremony which has taken place every evening at 8 o'clock since 1927. I showed my respect to everyone who had lost their lives and laid a wreath on behalf of Warblington School to show that we will never forget the soldiers.

I will never forget this trip since it was a once in a lifetime opportunity. A big thank you to Charles Haskell, Director of the First World War Museum in Portsmouth for taking me and to my Grandparents on this fantastic and emotional experience.
