Warblington Staff UV Football

On Friday 1st February, some of the Warblington School staff took part in UV Football. We have organised and run events for students and now it was our turn to don the UV paint and see what it is all about. Thank you to the PE Department for organising the event, which was a huge success and enjoyed by all.



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Enrichment Day: Safeguarding

On Wednesday 6th February we completed our third Enrichment Day looking at the topic of Safeguarding. Students followed sessions around the five themes of Social Behaviours, Healthy Lifestyles, Healthy Relationships, E-Safety and Health Minds.

We were joined by Southern Domestic Abuse who led sessions on child sexual exploitation (Year 8) and spiralling (Year 9); the Fire Brigade who led a session on road safety (Year 7); Living Your Learning who delivered a session on Mindfulness (Year 10) and the Y Service who led a session on LGBT (Year 9).

Here is what our students had to say about the day:

'We learned a lot about real life situations.' (Year 9 student)

'It helped me to be more positive about things that happen.' (Year 10 student)

'It was eye opening, the teacher spoke to us as individuals, the tea analogy was good.' (Year 10 student)

'Learnt a lot, interesting, useful.' (Year 8 student)

'Mrs Brown was amazing!' (Year 7 student)

When asked what they had learnt during the day, one Year 7 tutor group replied:

Domestic violence is not just physical violence. Cyber bullying can be worse than physical bullying. If a car travelled at 70mph it would take 96m to stop. Boys go through puberty later than girls.

I think this sums up their action packed day!

A lot of the material and resources used during the day were from the police website Safe4Me which I would recommend to our parents and carers as there is lots of information to support and inform you surrounding the safeguarding of our young people.

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




