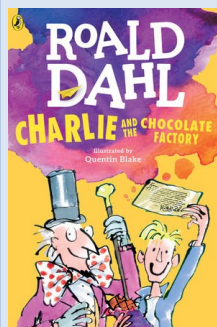
Macbeth Trip



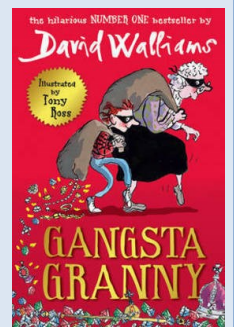

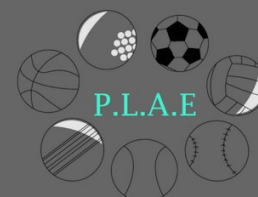
