Message from Mike Hartnell, Headteacher

Last week we welcomed Pam Simpson from Hampshire Advisory Service to look at our safeguarding procedures. I am pleased she echoed the recent Ofsted findings and we 'passed' with flying colours. Throughout both days of the visit, the students Pam spoke to were honest, courteous and a real credit to Warblington.

On Friday, I was pleased to speak to a group of future Headteachers who are currently embarking on their professional headship qualification about my first 100 days as a head. It was great to give something back and to reflect on my journey so far. As I said to them, now I have all the information, it is all about strategically implementing change to ensure Warblington now moves to becoming a world class school, where excellence is considered and expectation. As part of that, we are currently reviewing how some students behaviour is impacting their learning and sometimes the learning of others, and where appropriate, much stricter sanctions are being put in place to ensure this doesn't happen again. Over the next few weeks, students will be told of this in assemblies and we will keep you informed via this newsletter.

Also on Friday, Year 11's received their final set of results before the real GCSEs start in May. For many they have started to see their hard work pay off and many jumped over 20 grades in total compared to November! An amazing achievement! For others there was still some disappointment - particularly when they had worked really hard. We will be working closely with these students over the next few weeks to build their exam technique.

Finally, a plug. If your child hasn't registered for Seneca Learning yet, please encourage them to do so. Although aimed at those students in Years 10 & 11, it is a great revision tool for all ages, and the latest national competition for hours spent on the platform begins soon. The school that wins will receive £100 and national recognition - will this be the start of Warblington becoming recognised as national champions? Let's hope so!

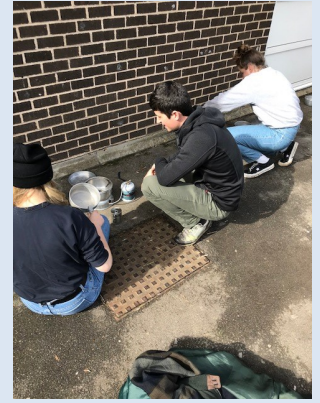
