Havant Youth Conference 2019



On Friday 15th March four Year 9 students attended the Havant Youth Conference 2019 at the Havant Plaza organised by Havant Borough Council. We all had a brilliant day taking part in presentations and activities based around the theme of 'Make It Count'.

We started the day with a welcome speech from the Mayor of Havant ClIr Peter Wade and also speeches from the Leader of Havant Borough Council ClIr Wilson and local authority ClIr Prad Bains who gave use an overview of the council and what it means to be a councillor. This was followed by a presentation by Mike

Locke from Havant and East Hants Mind who promote good mental health.

The day continued with two workshops, firstly a workshop on voting from Young Citizens who discussed why we should vote, should the voting age be lowered and why young people don't vote. Special mention goes to Tai for offering great answers and volunteering to speak in front of the group. The second workshop was on Smart Money from Citizens Advice. Students were able to find out how money works in the real world, including payslips, how much essential items cost and other things like learning to drive, your first car and weddings. They also explored ways to save money and better plan your money. Our students enjoyed these workshops which were very hands on and engaging. There was also some great competitions. Well done to Arun and Carina who both won prizes!

During lunchtime students had the opportunity to visit stalls from Motiv8, Off The Record and Oarsome Chance who had all attended the conference to put forward a bid for money for their organisations. Students would vote for which one they thought should get the grant. All three organisations would get a grant but how much of a grant depended on voting. All three organisations did brilliantly to get this far after applications and being chosen as the top three.

After lunch the voting commenced with ballots filled out and counted like official elections. While the votes were being counted students had a chance to meet with their local councillor and find out what its like to be a councillor and what the role entails. Our students met with Cllr Jackie Branson for the St. Faith's Ward (our local ward) and Cllr Lulu Bowerman for the Emsworth Ward. We had a in depth discussion and questions were given to our councillors as well as them asking our students and staff questions. A lot of great ideas and topics were covered during the discussion and left our students with lots of think about.


