Message from Mike Hartnell, Headteacher

As we end what has been a lovely week for spring weather, it has been an interesting week at school. I began the week by reinforcing expectations in year group assemblies. I defined behaviour as *'the way in which one acts or conducts oneself, especially towards others'* and that the majority of behaviours are a choice and therefore it is important to make the correct choice in any situation. Ofsted claim that students could be losing up to 38 days of learning every year due to low-level disruption. The report identified students calling out, rocking on chairs or not having the right equipment as common problems that hamper learning and waste lesson time. We will ensure that this remains a priority throughout the next term and into September.

I also wish to update you on uniform for September. I was hoping that we would have the outcome of the survey of students and parents out to you by now, in the form of a media release, created by some of our students. Our hold up is that the uniform you have chosen is unique to Warblington and therefore it is currently being specially made.

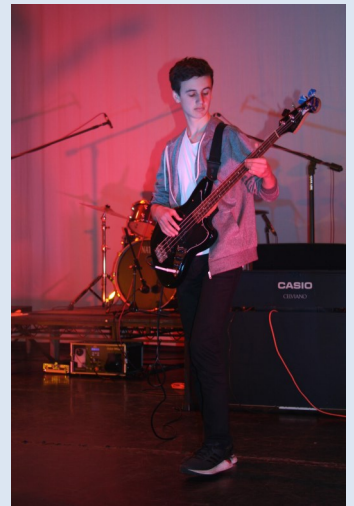
Success at the Portsmouth Music Festival

Our students had a fantastic day and everyone walked away with encouraging and inspiring feedback as well as awards for their musicianship.

It is a great feeling when they are able to see their dedication rewarded. Amazing Piece of English Homework from Kai Myers 8E

A diary entry from World War 1 from the point of view of a soldier.

Thursday 28th March 2014 English Home Work.

28th July 1914 The war has just started. My dad is one of the brave soldges that are going to the war. I'm verry happy but verry scard as well. My sister Elisabeth the 2nd. She is two years old so she dosent understand that her daddy is a Brave Soldger fighting for France ur country. I'm deling with it ok. But my mum is not she cries her self to sleep.

Me and my dad always playd out side in the yard we used to shoot the Pheasants he is the best. But ever since he joind up my mum and dad just kept shoking at each other at one point my dad hit my mum iv never seen him like that befor. I shoked at him and asked why did you do that but he said im to young im 12 years old they should be abil to tell me enything.

I do still love him but i dont know wheres he loves us or not. He said that if he dosent see me ever again that he loved me soo much. The Boss of daddy told us that we cant write to him until they have stood moste of the fighting at that point i was devastated because he said that we could write to him at enny time i wanted. But know we got told that we cant until well we dont even know whene. My Mum says that evry thing will be alright. But how dose she knew.

Thene I herd my mum on the talle phone i leard over the banaster an the stars to see if it was dad then my mum started to crye then i knew it was dad. She must have bin happy. But she didnt and put the phone buk on the stand. She saw me and asked how long was i there i said not long why?

I could see she was hiding some thing but she wouldn't tell me. I asked if that was Dad she said no but she looked guilty like some thing had happened. Mum made me some hot co-co I only get that if dad's posh people come round. At this point I knew some thing was up. She sat next to me and held my hand Mum's hand was so shaky she said I'm im... So sorry but daddy has had a horrific accident and won't see you ever again.

I didn't understand what she meant so I said have he died? She started to wobble and just hugged me. and whispered in my ear that he loved me and that we wouldn't forget about him and that he died of what he loved doing. And he died for our country and that we would have a hero in our hearts for ever.

But on top of that they said that his body was blown up by a bomb and that we couldn't have a funeral and we didn't have the money to live in over house with out daddy. I felt like a plastic bag surfing threw the wind. knowing that my baby sister will grow up not knowing who her daddy is.

2 weeks later.

My mum is not doing with it very well. And my baby sister is non stop crying and won't stop but Mum just leaves her and just expects me to deal with her. I'm struggling life is hard we moved house to a horrible labor hole and not much money just about feeding us. I fell like there's no point of me living I fell depressed.

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
