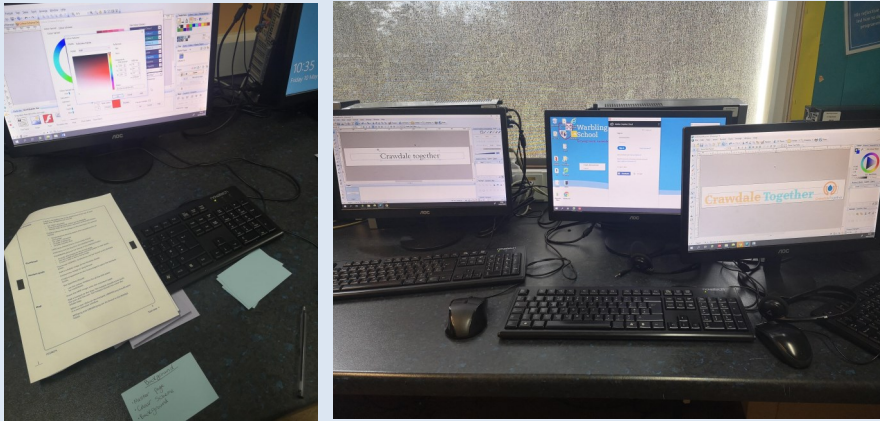

We are excited to be welcoming a group of Chinese pupils to Warblington School for the week commencing **8<sup>th</sup> July 2019**.

The visit aims to provide our students with an opportunity to broaden their international perspectives of the world, while building intercultural communication skills. Students will be introduced to Chinese culture and will be able to build friendships with students from the other side of the globe.

As part of this we are looking for friendly hosts to welcome the visiting Chinese students into their homes for the week, which can be a rewarding and exciting experience for the whole family.

**The Chinese students would stay with you for 6 nights, from Sunday to Saturday and would come in to school with your own child each day, and after school would spend the evening with your family. Families will be paid a total of £150 for each student hosted, and may host up to 4 students.**

### Bikes

From an environmental point of view it is good to see so many students cycling in and we would like to encourage more to do so.
