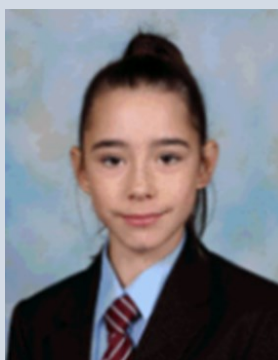

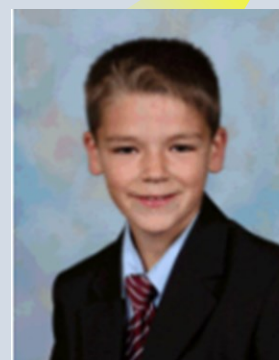

Science Discovery Group

In 1992, a laboratory assistant from Warblington School, Thelma Burridge and her friend, Val Swarbrick started the group as an off shoot of the Women's Institute when the government were keen to get women into science. Their original meetings were in the school laboratories where they undertook some experiments. Over the years it has evolved to become what it is today – a monthly meeting covering all aspects of science and open to men as well as women.

Warblington School has hosted our group since its inception but we are outgrowing this facility and in September we move to our new venue: the Emsworth Community Centre, North Street, Emsworth; next to the old cottage hospital. We will continue to meet on the 3rd Monday of the month, at 7:30pm excluding major holiday periods.

During this last financial year, we have had 9 meetings with an average of 53 attenders. The majority of our speakers come from local universities and we are grateful that nearly all have chosen to donate their honorarium to a charity of their choice. This has amounted to nearly £600 and the charities that have benefitted include: Water Aid, medical Detection Dogs, Bees Abroad, Cancer Research and Save the Children.

This year we have made a profit of nearly £500 which we have decided to donate to the science department at Warblington School. This cheque was presented to Mr Jim Lush-Smith, Head of Science, on Monday 20th May at our usual meeting. We were pleased that Val Swarbrick and Thelma Burridge were able to attend and Val gave a short introduction about the SDG.

This was followed by an excellent talk from Dr Gareth Hinds of the National Physical Laboratory. He spoke about the role of Lithium batteries and Hydrogen fuel cells in new cars and the issues around manufacturing and recycling these new modalities.

Our next talk is on Monday June 17th at Warblington School. We are fortunate to have Prof Daniel Thomas, Professor of Astrophysics at Portsmouth University back again. His talk will be entitled: "Was Einstein right that he was wrong?" See our website: www.sciencediscoverygroup.co.uk for future talks and further information.

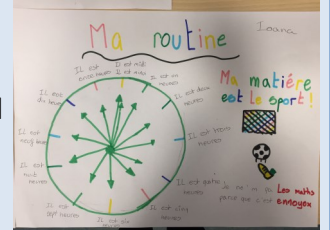
French Posters
