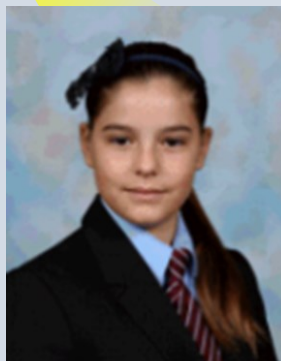

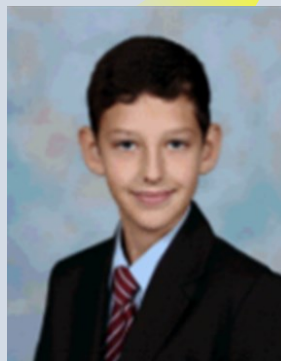

Recruiting In Havant

Who are the Volunteer Police Cadets?

The VPC is a uniformed youth organisation for ages 13 to 17. It is designed to provide a safe environment in which young people of Hampshire and the Isle of Wight can learn as individuals; develop positive relationships with the police; and actively support their community.

We aim to help you prepare for your future by providing a variety of activities and opportunities; enhancing your inter-personal skills and confidence; and encouraging you to achieve a sense of pride through supporting your local community and policing teams.

We will be recruiting for the Havant Unit in September 2019 and invite interested local young people to apply.

What Do Cadets Do?

Cadets are issued with a uniform and attend a weekly 2 hour session during term times, where they receive inputs on a wide range of police and community related topics; receive visits from various police units; be supported in obtaining the Duke of Edinburgh Awards; and develop inter-personal skills and confidence.

As well as this weekly session our cadets commit to volunteering for a minimum of 3 hours per month on policing and community initiatives with their Unit and as part of Hampshire Constabulary's community engagement activities.

Why?

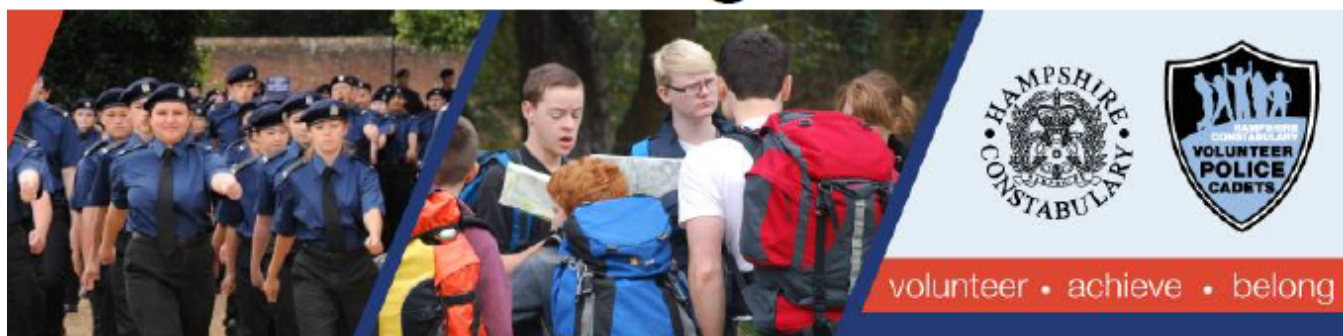
