Message from Mike Hartnell, Headteacher

As each year group filed in, sporting their impeccably worn uniform, you could see many things – smiles from both the students and staff at being back, pride in their new uniform and the excitement of a new school year and the opportunities and challenges that this brings.

I would like to thank you for ensuring the overwhelming majority of students came with the correct uniform and correct equipment on day 1. It has made a massive difference, and having your support is always appreciated. We have introduced our 'Ready to Learn' system – a very simple behaviour system where students are given one warning before being removed from the lesson, ensuring the focus of every lesson is on learning and progress. I would like to welcome everybody back from their break, and also to Mrs Woodford-Richens in History, Mrs Devine in Science, Mrs Roper in Art and Photography and Mrs Lansley who joins us as a PE teacher and Assistant Headteacher. Also, I would like to wish a warm welcome to the 140 new Year 7's who started with us on Wednesday. Despite the nerves in the first assembly, they have settled in fantastically!
