### Message from Mike Hartnell, Headteacher

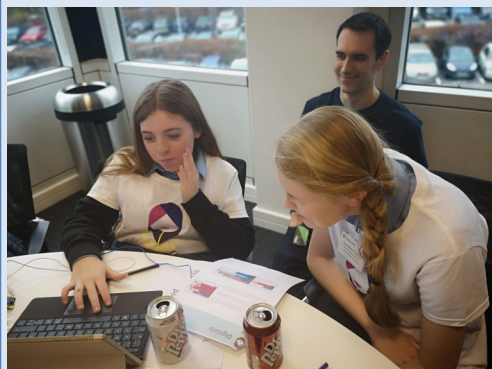
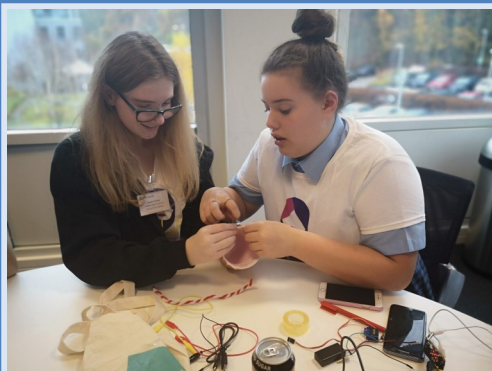

### Digigirlz Event at Microsoft

In October, I received an email confirmation that Warblington School was successful in our application for the Digigirlz event. This one day event is organised and hosted by Microsoft at their headquarters in Reading and aims to promote Computer Science to girls in Year 8.

On Monday 25<sup>th</sup> November, 200 girls from around the southern region attended this event. The students had an introductory talk by one of the 'Bosses' at Microsoft, followed by another inspiring talk. The students were tasked with creating and programming something that would help the environment become a better and more sustainable place. Our two groups of 4 came up with brilliant ideas. One group creating a 'Bin-Full' notifier which the council could use to collect full bins and the other group created a 'Micro-bead' collector which would scour the sea for microbeads which would then be collected. The students, once finished with their task, presented their ideas to a panel of 4 judges (Dragon's Den style). 3 awards were given: Best pitch, Best use of

technology, and best sustainable concept. Warblington School won the best sustainable concept and beat approximately 50 other groups to do this. Well done girls! I am very proud of what you achieved!
