### Dragonfly Day @ Southampton University

A group of our Year 9 students had a jam packed day at Southampton University for their Dragonfly Day on Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> December! The day included a variety of STEM related workshops, talks from inspirational women, careers and a campus tour. The highlight of the day, apart from sampling the university food, was the first workshop we attended where students could see their high powered x-ray machine in action by x-raying a Christmas cracker and trying to guess what is inside. Also in this

workshop students were able to step inside a fossil using VR technology. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed this experience! Other workshops included tribology (science of friction) and looking at sustainability and waste and how we can recycle and reuse to turn our waste products into resources. There is no waste, everything can be used again in one form or another. To finish the day we had a campus tour. We visited the library which is set over 5 massive floors, the largest lecture theatre, the sports facilities, the formula student racing team and we stepped inside their very own wind tunnel. We had a brilliant day and we would like to say a huge thank you to Debbie our student ambassador who looked after us during the day. Mr Clinton took some Year 8's to Southampton University this week as part of our continued work with STEM subjects. Students had a chance to have a virtual reality tour inside a fossil as well as seeing the wind tunnel Team GB use for testing! All who went came back really buzzing with excitement!

Year 10's had their Employer Interview day this week. This is where every child has a 20 minute interview with an employer, to simulate the types of things they will be asked when going for a job. Employers also give them some brief feedback. Pleasingly, 95% of the students felt their presentation skills had improved as a result and that their confidence had improved in communicating with employers. Ian Connor one of the interviewees said how he was impressed by "the enthusiasm and passion shown by the students for their future aspirations".

As you can see our Year 8 students are working hard to support Mission Christmas, if you are able to, please support them where you can. Our Year 7 students are also collecting food for the Beacon Food Bank. Keep up the brilliant work everyone!

### Money Mules - Child Exploitation

We are urging parents and guardians to warn children about the dangers of becoming a money mule.

A money mule is someone who transfers stolen money through their own bank account on behalf of someone else and is paid for doing so.

Criminals use money mules to launder the profits of their crimes.

Young people are often unaware that acting as a money mule is illegal. They are approached to take part online or in person, including through social media, at school, college or sports clubs.

Spot the signs and follow these tips on how to stay safe:

- Make sure your child doesn't give their bank account details to anyone unless they know and trust them.
- Tell them to be cautious of unsolicited offers of easy money, because if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is.
- Look out for your child suddenly having extra cash, buying expensive new clothes or electronics with very little explanation as to how they got the money.
- A young person involved in money muling may become more secretive, withdrawn or appear stressed.

Parents and guardians are advised not to attempt to contact any individual they suspect of organising money muling and should instead contact Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111 Or 101 and ask for the Hampshire Missing, Exploited & Trafficked Police.

It is important that we are able to identify our Young Carers so that support can be provided along with special consideration for the difficulties that they may encounter. This support is co-ordinated by Mrs Copeman who should be contacted if you have any queries or if you believe that your son/daughter is a Young Carer.
