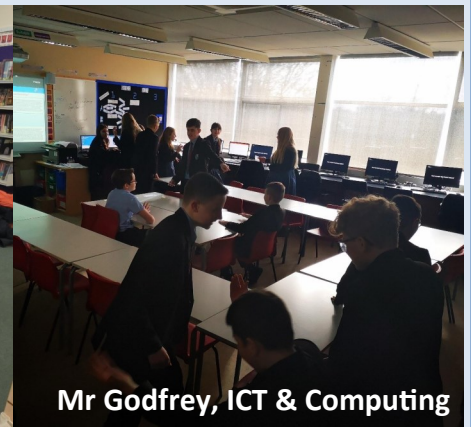
Our students took part in the following activities:

CODE OF CONDUCT

Working with our Parents/Carers

We believe that working effectively in partnership with parents/carers is essential to ensuring the highest standards of welfare and success of our students. We would therefore like to thank parents/carers for their support and efforts in working closely with us to achieve this aim.

We expect our staff to respond in a timely, courteous and professional manner to parent queries or concerns. In return parents are requested to uphold these standards whether communication is by telephone, e-mail or in person. Most issues should be resolved by the member of staff most closely associated with the concern raised. We aim to deal with all complaints seriously and work to resolve them. There should therefore be no need to approach the Headteacher, Governors, LA or Ofsted as a means to fast-forward your complaint. In exceptional circumstances, reference to our Complaints Procedure is recommended.

Resolution of issues is always of high priority and in order to do so effectively communication should be calm, respectful and appreciative of there being more sides to an issue than parents or staff might initially be aware of. It is the case that when issues are complex we do require the time to investigate thoroughly to understand what has happened in order to make informed decisions and conclusions. Thank you again for maintaining positive relationships and enabling us to focus our attentions on educating your child to ensure that they make positive progress.

Concerns

Complaints or concerns should be addressed to the person who was most heavily involved in the incident, unless it is of a very personal nature to do with that staff member, in which case it should be addressed to their line manager. In line with the Complaints Policy, the Headteacher should not be involved immediately and should only become involved when the correct procedure has been followed in order to allow a suitably neutral review of your concern if necessary.

We ask that parents do not respond to any text message or phone call that your child might send during the day about events that happen. This can cause parents to overreact which is often unhelpful as they are unaware of context or action already taken. Students know that they should contact Reception if they want to make contact with parents.

Inflammatory comments or statements should be avoided and the tone should be courteous at all times – emotive and accusatory words such as ‘disgusting’, use of capitals or defamatory statements should not be included. The complaint should reflect the information you have currently received; the assumption should be that you have one version of the matter which is a concern, rather than concluding you have the totality of the information.

Each complainant will represent their own views and should not seek to present themselves as self-appointed spokesperson for others.

We aim to deal with all complaints seriously and work to resolve them, there is no need to threaten with the Governors, LA or Ofsted as a means to fast-forward your complaint.

Meetings will be arranged where and when it is deemed necessary. Concerns around safety or child protection will be dealt with immediately otherwise appointments will need to be made in advance to be seen by a staff member.

We do not expect parents to make complaints, accusations or bring the College’s reputation into disrepute on any social media website.

Any concerns and complaints which are received which do not comply with our expectations will be returned unattended until the communications meet the expectations outlined above. Parents who breach the terms will be subject to restricted access to staff.

These standards apply to written and verbal complaints.

Warblington School Uniform

Students are ambassadors of the school and are expected to show pride in the way they dress and behave in a way that reflects the standards we seek to achieve. The uniform should be smart with all items clearly marked. The school will NOT accept incorrect uniform.

The Warblington School uniform consists of:

- Clip-on school tie
- Mid-blue shirt, plain, with collar and top button. (Not denim, polo/t-shirt or blouse style)
- Black blazer with Warblington School Logo
- (Optional) School V Neck black jumper with blue stripe (no other jumpers are permissible)
- Black trousers embroidered with the Warblington School logo (available from Skool Kit) or tailored black trousers (embroidered badge available from school reception for acceptable trousers)
- Sensible, plain black footwear



Girls:

- Grey blue SK308 tartan skirt which must be knee length (available from Skool Kit only)

If cost of uniform is a problem, please contact the school.

No unreasonable haircuts or styles. Hair colour must be natural.

Body piercings are unacceptable and must be removed.

The only jewellery allowed is a watch and a pair of earrings (small studs, not hoops).

Nose studs must be removed and replaced with a clear retainer.

Nail varnish/acrylic nails must not be worn.

False eyelashes are not allowed and they will need to be removed.



Equipment

All students are expected to bring the correct equipment to school every day.



Mobile Phones

Students may bring in a phone but it must be switched off in their bag or left at Reception from 8:00am onwards. It can then be collected at the end of the day. **Not at any time during the day will they be able to have access.**

Any phone which is seen will be confiscated and handed into Reception where they can be collected at the end of the day by the student.

We believe that students should be digitally separated during the school day. Therefore we are a mobile phone free site.
