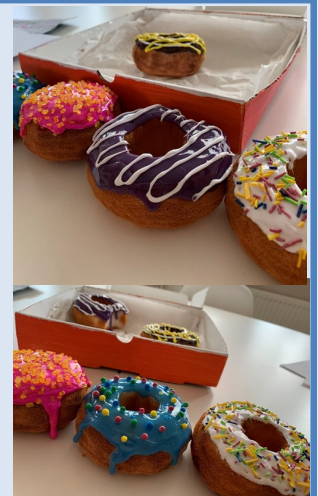


## Year 10 Art PPE

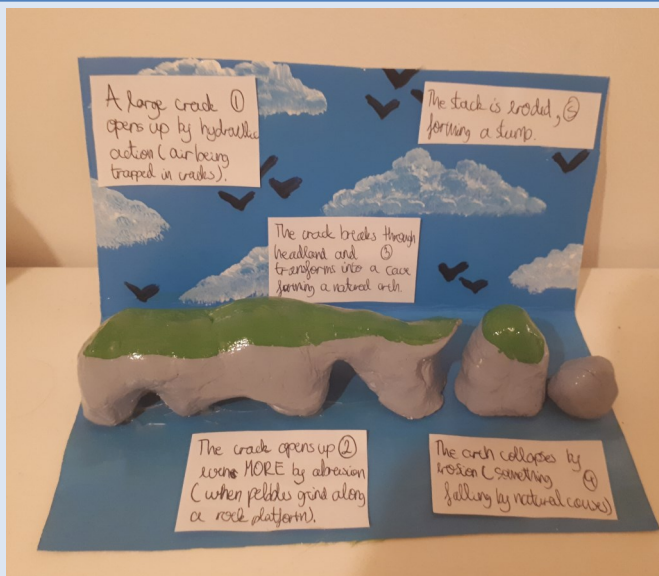

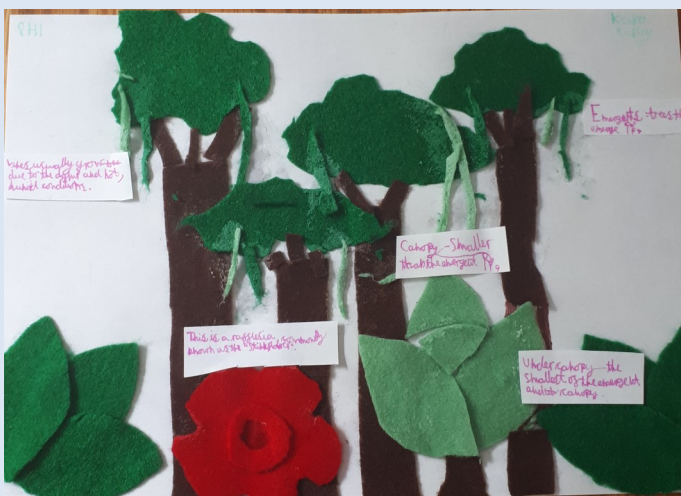
