# **Food Preparation and Nutrition**



10 House points for all posters selected for display


20 House points for 3<sup>rd</sup> place in KS3 and KS4

Each correctly answered question earns you a point for your House!


More information will be announced today on ClassCharts at 3:00pm when the challenge starts.


# **Maths Help Desk**

## **South Downs Planetarium Star Show Go Online**

The approach of bringing the Planetarium night sky into your home with free virtual night sky tours, has been created by the team at the South Downs Planetarium. This is probably a first - certainly in this country and maybe the world - and will be an additional and really exciting way to understand the night sky as it is in February.

These events are planned to coincide and be a part of the South Downs National Park, Dark Skies Festival. The free virtual night sky tours will take place on **Friday 12th February**, **Wednesday 17th February** and **Wednesday 24th February**, all beginning at 7pm.

The tour on the 17th will include a detailed look at the Red Planet, Mars, which is also on view this month, and the landing of the Mars Rover Perseverance the following day.

The tour on the 24th will include an in-depth look at our nearest celestial neighbour, the Moon, which will be shining brightly in our skies at the time. In addition, on **Friday 19th February** at 6pm, Dr Mason will be taking part in a Facebook Live Question and Answer session, giving you a chance to ask questions about the Mars landing and any other astronomy-related subjects.

#### Staff Family Member's Idea for Break Time Exercise

- 1. First, get a A4 piece of paper.
- 2. Then fold it into 16 even sections (fold in half 4 times).
- 3. Write an exercise or a stretch in each section, like run on the spot for a minute, skipping a hundred skips without stopping, star jumps, dancing etc. Choose your favourites and some that you want to get better at, like touching your toes or the plank.
- 4. Then cut the paper into the sections so there is an exercise on each one and fold them.

5. Put the folded paper in a box or even a hat. When you need a break, take out a piece of paper and do the exercise it says and have fun!

You need to take regular breaks away from the screen or your static sitting work position. This break time exercise gets you moving and stretching helping your body to recover. Why not try it out during your next break between class or working?










'Gingerbread House' by Gaudi. Mr Whitlock, Art


