
I took on this challenge because I love science and I am passionate about the subject. I was



Geography Fieldwork

Fieldwork is an essential component of Geography education. Here at Warblington we are developing the enquiry approach to fieldwork throughout both key stage 3 and key stage 4 as it enables students to better understand the 'messiness' of 'geographical reality'. This week we have allowed Year 9 to use their mobile phones as a tool to measure noise pollution, using the free app 'Sound Meter Pro' comparing locations outside of our school site, with internal locations. To answer the hypothesis 'Is pollution a problem at Warblington?'. We have also introduced our Year 7's to some fieldwork techniques to allow them to complete their 'How Safe is My Street?' enquiry over the Easter Break. **Mr Strzelec, Geography**

A huge well done to everyone who has contributed to the Race to Tokyo


House Challenge since it started! Here is where each House has approximately got to so far along the 6000 mile route:

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Warblington School History 1957-1959 Exams & Achievements

From its inaugural year, Warblington school celebrated the many successes of its students with an annual Speech and Prize Day. As the years progressed, there were many other achievements to honour. In January 1958, Terence Mansbridge won First Prize in the Fry's Chocolate National Painting Competition, and the following week the school won The Portsmouth School Hockey Tournament. Michael Crook was chosen for a part in The National Youth Theatre's 1960 production of Hamlet, where Derek Jacobi took the lead. In May, 1958 students from Warblington won 1st, 2nd and 3rd in the schools sprinting competition out of over 1600 entrants. The evening Cycling Proficiency course presented by Major Harris and the police was passed by all 20 pupils.

Parents' Evenings were extremely well supported with over 95% attendance at Year 7, 8 and 9 evenings in June 1958. Over 600 parents attended the Speech and Prize giving evening that December. The Art and Craftwork exhibition held in July for parents of children who would be coming to the school included displays of physical training, music by the choir and orchestra and displays of dresses thus enabling large numbers of pupils to demonstrate the high standard of their achievements.

Students were entered for a variety of examinations, including GCEs, Royal Society of Arts exams (RSA), and Union of Educational Institutions exams. RSA exams were held in the evening from 7:00pm—9:00pm with a high success rate. Mock GCE's were held in late February and March with the actual exams starting in the last week of June. Results were not released until the following September.


Not everything went to plan. On opening the GCE history papers in July 1958, it was found that the wrong papers had been sent. The only solution was to contact other schools in the area to find if they had any spares. Fortunately, Southern Girls Grammar School in Portsmouth did. However, the exam was then held one and half-hours late.

Students at Warblington achieve huge sporting successes. Over 150 students came on Saturdays to play soccer, netball, hockey and other sports. Over 100 went swimming in the evening at Hayling Holiday camps. There was one area where they were beaten and that was in the staff versus students soccer matches. Year after year, they succumbed to defeat. However, students were able to hold the staff to a draw in

hockey.

P How do I register for my app?

You will need to follow the instructions sent to you via email/letter. If you haven't received this email/letter yet, speak to your school.

W How do I download the app?

You can go to your preferred app store, search Weduc and the app will appear for you to download. Please note that you will only be able to log in if your school has bought Weduc.

Simply open up your app and enter your login details. You would have created these when you first registered for Weduc.

I am not able to download the app, how else can I log in?

You can access Weduc on any internet enabled device. Speak to your school.

Can I use Weduc without registering?
Unfortunately not. Due to the permissions

Unfortunately not. Due to the permissions within the system, only staff members that have enrolled are able to log on.

I am a teacher and a parent and/or I teach at more than one school, do I need multiple logins?

The good news is, no you don't. Weduc has the ability to allow more than one school to be accessible under one login. As long as your school has set up the right access rights for you, you will be able to flick between each school within Weduc. Please see the training manual on how to do this if you are unsure.

Support With Heating Costs For Families Facing Winter Hardship Due To COVID 19

Information for Parents and Carers

As part of the Connect4Communities programme, the Citizens Advice Service is helping families and individuals with energy costs over the winter period – gas, electric and water.

The COVID Winter Grant scheme has been extended to 16 April, meaning this help is available for a few more weeks.

Please note that the local branch will complete a quick eligibility check and refer parents and carers to the distributors of the grant and financial support will be provided to the family or individual seeking help.

The eligibility criteria for this support - to heat homes - is wide-ranging to ensure the money is as accessible as possible and is as follows:

Families with children:

Families in receipt of benefits related free school meals.

Families including 16-18-year olds previously eligible for Free School Meals.

All children with a social worker.

All children open to Early Help.

All households with 2 - 4year olds accessing childcare and eligible for Early Years Pupil Premium.

Households with a young carer.

Those who it is believed will struggle to afford to heat their home adequately and/or maintain a reasonable standard of living this winter.

Households without children:

Care leavers

Households that have been identified as going into debt for the first time

Households or individuals with no other way of obtaining funds, e.g. those who face choosing to pay either rent or bills (considered unmanageable debt)

Those who it is believed will struggle to afford to heat their home adequately and/or maintain a reasonable standard of living this winter

Support from this fund, distributed by the Citizens Advice Service, can take the form of:

Pre-paid energy cards or the payment of a fuel bill on behalf of an eligible household
