### Message from The Editor, Miss Barker

This week our new communication system Weduc went live ready for the official launch on Monday

10th May. Weduc is a hub for information, communication and knowledge for Warblington School and is replacing our use of Parentmail. You will have received an email to create your account. We are starting to build up the amount of information we have on the app but it may take us some time to get it completely up-to-date. In the mean time, please have a look at all the areas on the app which include:

- **Newsfeed** – Here you will find images and information about classes and the whole school. A bit like a social media feed.
- **Calendar** – Check regularly to ensure you don't miss anything.
- **Messages** – Through 'push notifications' you will receive information messages. You will also receive messages that you need to action just by the push of a button. You will be able to give consent for trips or events. Please ensure that you enable push notifications on your phone.
- **The Hub** – This will signpost links to other websites we ask you to use such as ClassCharts, parents evening booking system, policies and curriculum links.
- **Forms** – Here you will find various forms, which you might need to access at some point. They do not need to be completed unless it is required.

### School Transition Sponsorship

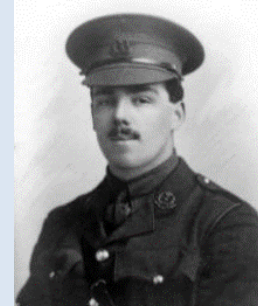
This involves sponsorship of our transition water bottles which will be handed out to prospective students in our feeder schools when we visit.

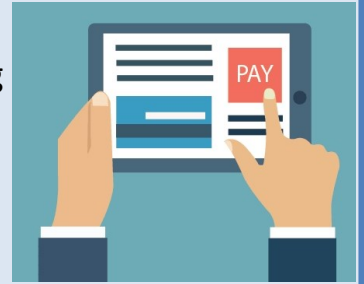

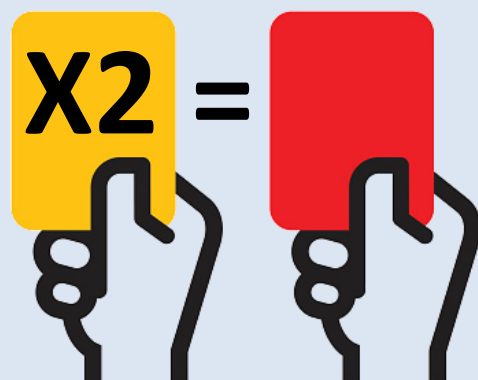

## Our Behaviour System: Reflection Room & Wave 3

Here is clarification of our behaviour system. As before, two yellow cards equals a red card so if a student receives a second yellow card from their subject teacher, the consequence is a red card and the remainder of the lesson in the Reflection Room. The sanction for receiving a red card is a 30 minute detention that day (unless the lesson is during period 5 in which case the detention is the next day). Should a student not attend their detention, the parent and student are sent an announcement on ClassCharts to let them know that they have one more chance to complete their detention. If they still fail to attend the detention, then they spend a day in Wave 3 where they are out of circulation from the rest of the school for the whole day with a one hour detention afterwards: 8:35am - 4:00pm.

### FAQ



#### How do I register for my app?

You will need to follow the instructions sent to you via email/letter. If you haven't received this email/letter yet, speak to your school.

#### How do I download the app?

You can go to your preferred app store, search Weduc and the app will appear for you to download. Please note that you will only be able to log in if your school has bought Weduc.

#### How do I login to my app?

Simply open up your app and enter your login details. You would have created these when you first registered for Weduc.

#### I am not able to download the app, how else can I log in?

You can access Weduc on any internet enabled device. Speak to your school.

#### Can I use Weduc without registering?

Unfortunately not. Due to the permissions within the system, only staff members that have enrolled are able to log on.

#### I am a teacher and a parent and/or I teach at more than one school, do I need multiple logins?

The good news is, no you don't. Weduc has the ability to allow more than one school to be accessible under one login. As long as your school has set up the right access rights for you, you will be able to flick between each school within Weduc. Please see the training manual on how to do this if you are unsure.

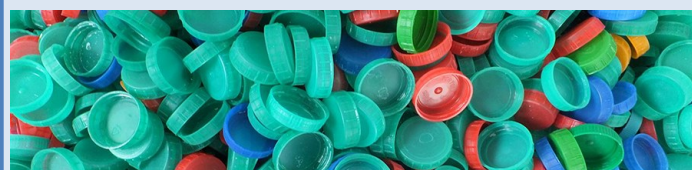

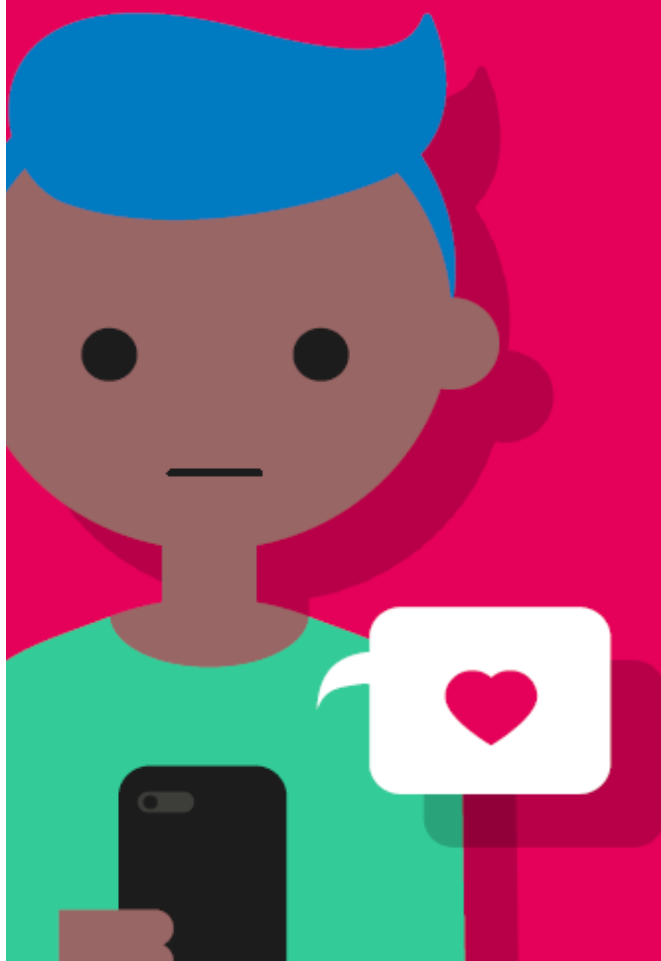
