### School Transition Sponsorship

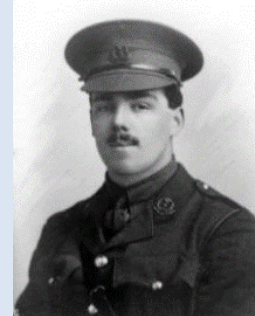
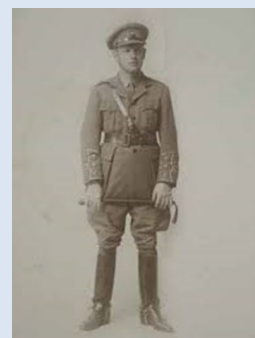
This involves sponsorship of our transition water bottles which will be handed out to prospective students in our feeder schools when we visit.



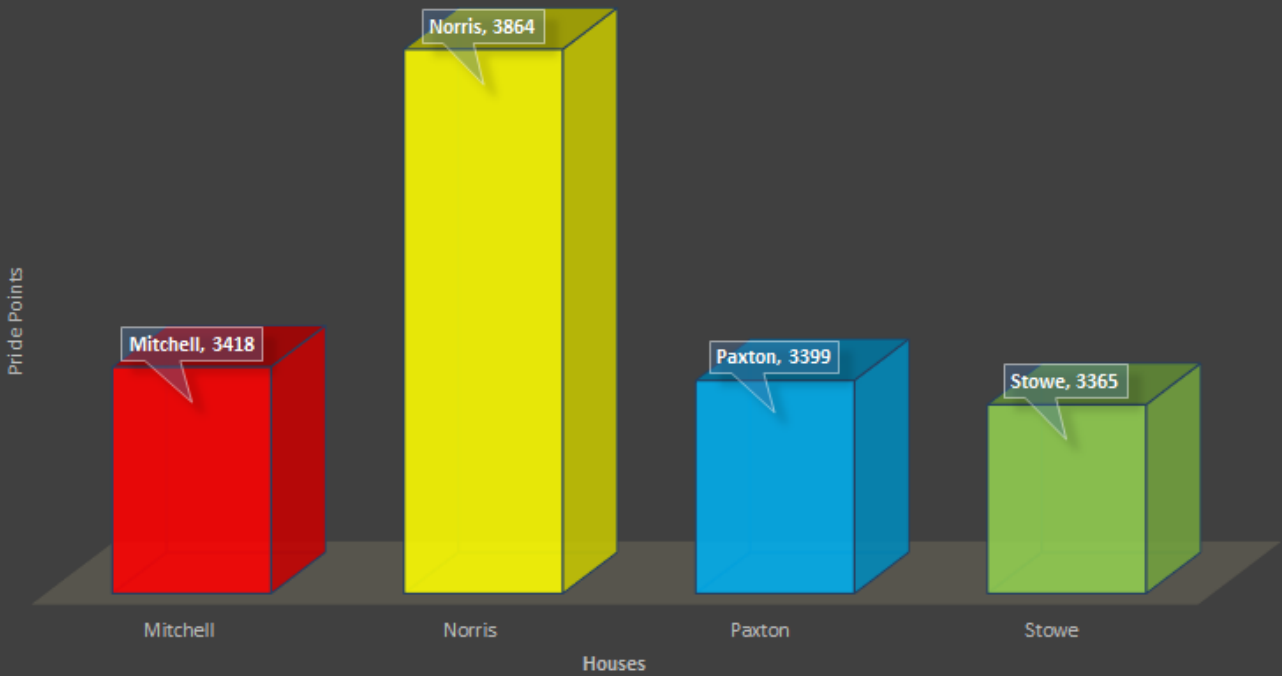

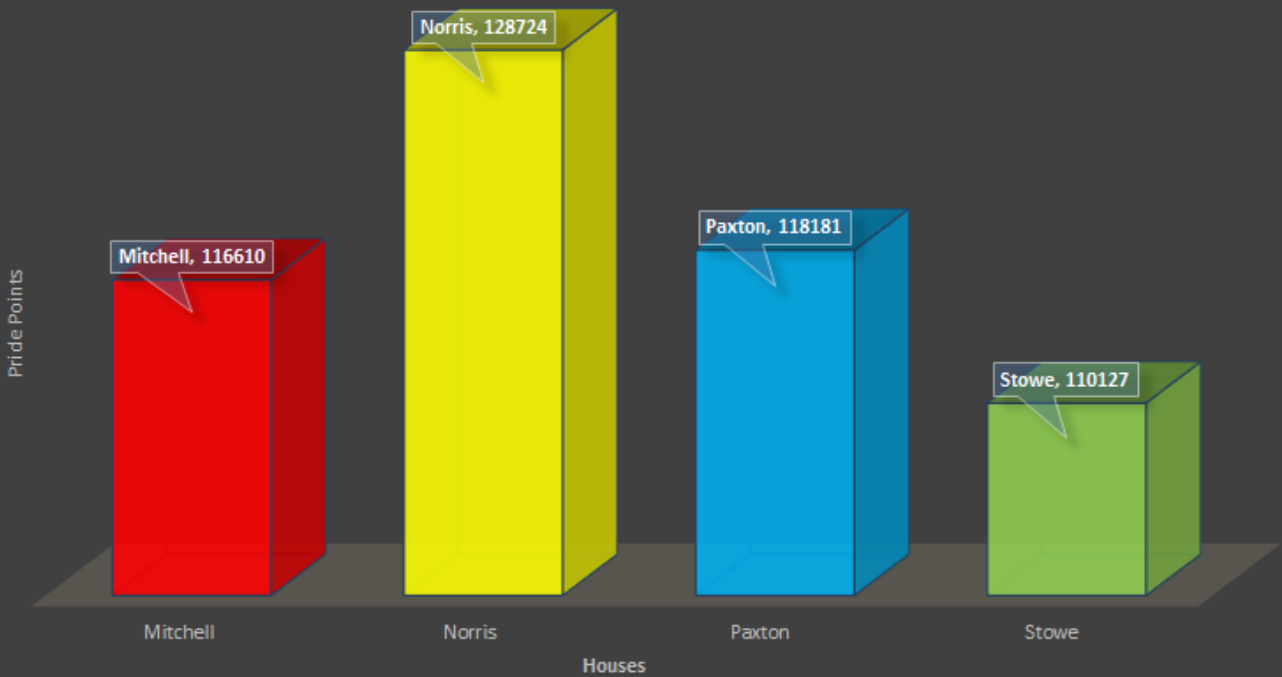
