

Year 7 - Acids & Alkalis


Year 7 have been investigating acids, alkalis and neutralisation and even managed to create a rainbow. Awesome work, well done everyone!

Year 8 are enjoying their practical investigations. Keep up the great work, well done!




Year 8 - Climate Change






