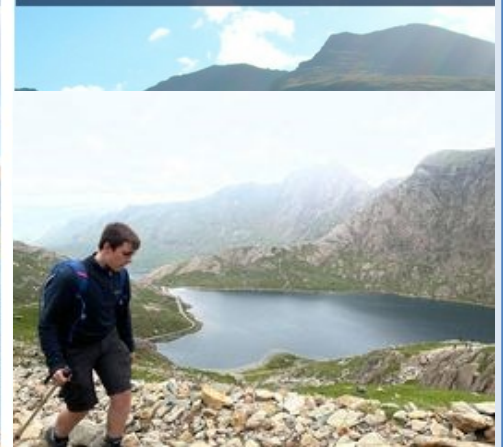

Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award Assessed Expedition 26th-27th June 2021

Last weekend, three groups of our students successfully completed their Assessed Expedition for their DofE Bronze Award. They coped brilliantly with the challenging route and the variety of weather conditions.

They started on Saturday morning at Butser Hill, each group headed through Queen Elizabeth Country Park, the Buriton area and followed the South Downs Way to East Harting where they camped overnight at Marden Farm.

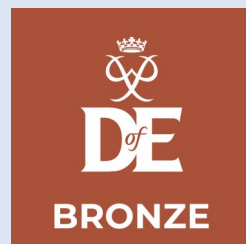

Face Masks

Please make sure that your child brings a face mask to school. Face masks still need to be worn inside the school building in the corridors and in the Hall at break and lunch times when students are not eating. Year 9 Science

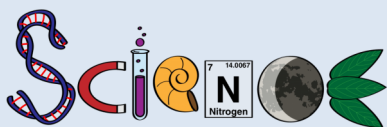

As you maybe aware from September 2021 we are changing our school ties to individual House ties allowing students to proudly display what House they are in.

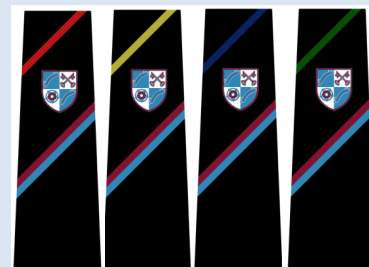
From Monday 28th June the ties will go on sale for pre-order via WEDUC for online payments only at the discounted price of £2 for our current Year 7-10 students.

School Transition Sponsorship

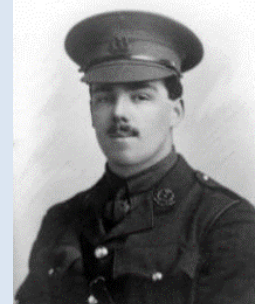
This involves sponsorship of our transition water bottles which will be handed out to prospective students in our feeder schools when we visit.

Havant Borough Council Great Big Green Week

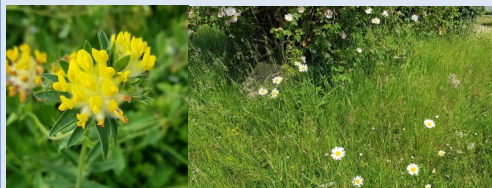
A week to celebrate what people around the Borough have been doing to protect nature, tackle waste and take action.

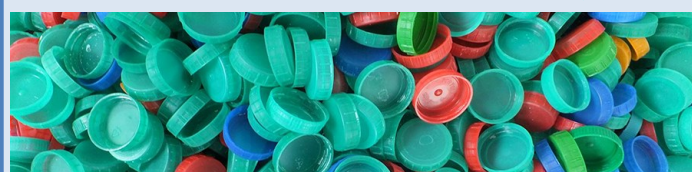
