Feel free to complete a whole shoe box yourself and bring it into Reception. Shoe boxes must be completed and in school by Friday 17th September at the very latest as these need to go to the children urgently. The original deadline was extended.

GET ready to clean up litter from the shoreline and the sea as part of the Havant Borough Green Week.

The event, which runs from September 18th-26th, will see films, craft activities, displays, wildlife walks, working parties, a repair cafe, bike repairs, litter picks and talks at venues across the town.

On Sunday, September 19th there will be a litter pick on land and paddle boards. Meet in the car park by the Ship Inn at Langstone at 11am, organised by FatFace.

There'll be a display in the Meridian Centre, Havant, showcasing the work of local groups and artwork using trash.

The Mayor of Havant, our very own Councilor Rosy Raines, is hosting a zero waste Fairtrade coffee morning and lots of schools are organising activities during the week, including using local produce, having meat-free days and encouraging children to walk or cycle to school.

Sue James, one of the organisers, said: 'It's clear that lots of groups and individuals around the area really care about our changing climate, waste and loss of wildlife.

The idea is to show the politicians how much people care. In November,



there are crucial climate talks in Glasgow and we need far more commitment from countries around the world (and from local authorities) if we are to stop runaway global heating, which is already causing flooding, wildfires and sea level rises.

'We need to cut our use of fossil fuels really fast. So, let's have a really enjoyable week but hopefully make a few changes too.'
