Halloween Just Dance

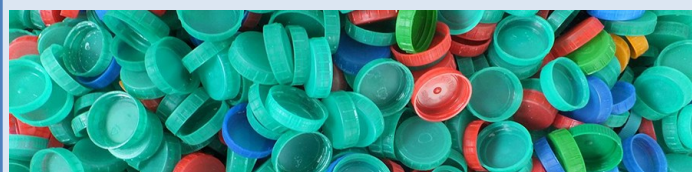
When you walk past Gateway and there is some Halloween Just Dance taking place as a reward for completing their Maths assessment.

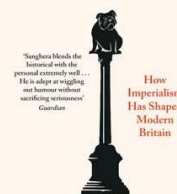

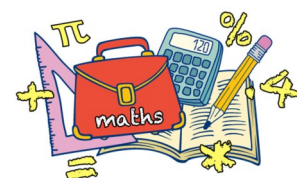

Have Your Say on the Future of Children and Young People in Hampshire

Hampshire is renewing its Children and Young People's Plan in 2022. The plan is used to help transform the future of children and young people in Hampshire, supporting them to thrive and achieve their full potential. The Children's Trust in developing the next edition of its Children and Young People's Plan, your views are needed whether you are a parent, a carer or a professional working with children.

Please complete the survey to help the Children's Trust understand what matters most to you. The survey asks about what you think is good about raising or working with children and young people in Hampshire, what you think is not so good, and areas where improvement should be prioritised. The survey deadline is Sunday 7th November. It takes 10-15 minutes to complete and is open to parents and carers of children under the age of 20, and professionals who work with children under the age of 20. You could even help collect more feedback, by sharing the survey with any Hampshire-based friends and family who have children.

What is the Children and Young People's Plan? The plan is used to help transform the future of children and young people in Hampshire, supporting them to thrive and achieve their full potential. It is the overarching strategy for the multi-agency Hampshire Children's Trust. It reflects a shared commitment to improve the lives of children, young people and families in the county, and to make Hampshire a great place to enjoy childhood.

What does the plan do? The Children and Young People's Plan identifies the key objectives we want to achieve for children, young people, and families in Hampshire. For each aim, there will be activities that partners can carry out together to contribute to shared outcomes.

What is the Children's Trust? Hampshire Children's Trust is a partnership of organisations across Hampshire, including schools, police and voluntary organisations. Collectively, they are responsible for services for children, young people and their families. The partners are committed to working together and co-operating with each other to better understand and address the needs of the more vulnerable children in Hampshire. Their vision is to make Hampshire an even better place where all children and young people - including those who are vulnerable or disadvantaged - have the best possible start in life and are supported by the whole community to succeed.

Your View Matters! We will use feedback from children, young people, parents and carers, as well as professionals who work with children, young people and families to design a new set of goals. Our partners will then decide how they can contribute to these priorities.
