## Year 7 History House Competition

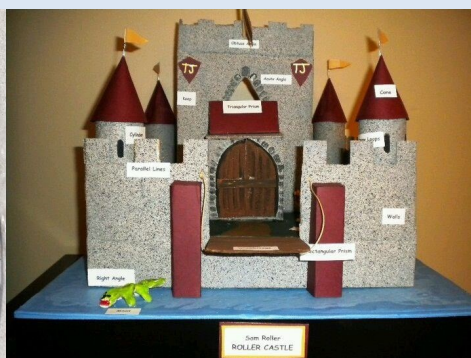


Challenge: Research Medieval Castles, information can be found on ClassCharts to help and create your own version of a Medieval Castle.

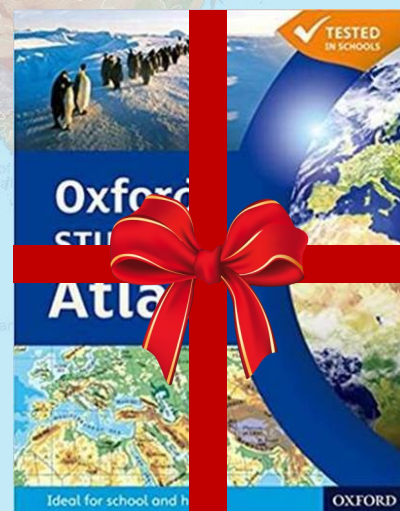

## Letting Go of Litter in 2022

### Eco Committee Appeal



We have a pandemic in Britain. Another one. It is litter. Litter costs over £1 billion a year in clean up bills. 30 million tonnes of litter are collected from our streets every year. This money could go to families, schools, parks, sports clubs and leisure facilities.

Litter is ugly – it ruins views, river walks, countryside rambles and drives. It attracts rats and pests that spread diseases. Littering reduces people's sense of well-being and attracts crime. If someone drops litter, someone has to pick it up. This is meant money is not available to buy sports equipment, musical equipment, smaller classes or school trips.

Litter kills. Shrews, bank voles, wood mice and birds can get stuck or die within discarded bottles; they can also choke on 'yokes' – the ring pulls on cans. 13 million tonnes of British litter is burnt, releasing poisonous fumes that circulate the world. Litter is buried releasing methane which is 28 times more powerful at creating climate change than carbon dioxide. Litter never disappears. Metals and plastic stay in the environment for hundreds and thousands of years.

Why do people litter? Mainly because they see other people littering and we have got used to seeing litter everywhere. People don't know most litter does not get picked up. There is so much litter, it is too expensive to collect. The money is needed for more important things like saving lives in hospitals, keeping our neighbours safe and our schools equipped.

But we are going to fight back in 2022. More and more people are joining beach cleans and litter picks in their area. If everyone reused their plastic bottles, just once, this would save 16 million plastic bottles every day. If we put our waste in bins, it saves money for better things and it saves the lives of animals and people. Make this your New Year's resolution – Reuse more, waste less for a healthier, happier year.







## Christmas Dinner 2021

Here is a reminder for our students and staff about this years Christmas dinner. Students eligible for Free School Meals will be provided with a Christmas dinner on this day.

On Wednesday 15th December, which is also Christmas Jumper Day, Christmas dinner will be the only meal available on this day so if your child isn't having the Christmas dinner, they will need to bring a packed lunch and drink to school.

The meal will come with a bottle of water and a mince pie. Please be aware that the kitchen will be closed at break time in preparation and there will be nothing else available to purchase on this day. Please see the menu on page 11 for more information.

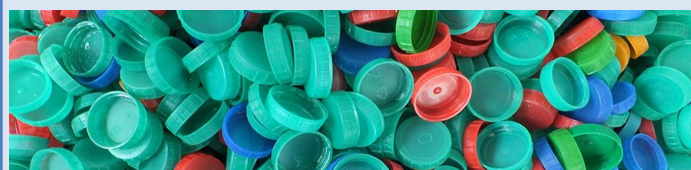
