We wish all our school community a wonderful Christmas and a Happy New Year!

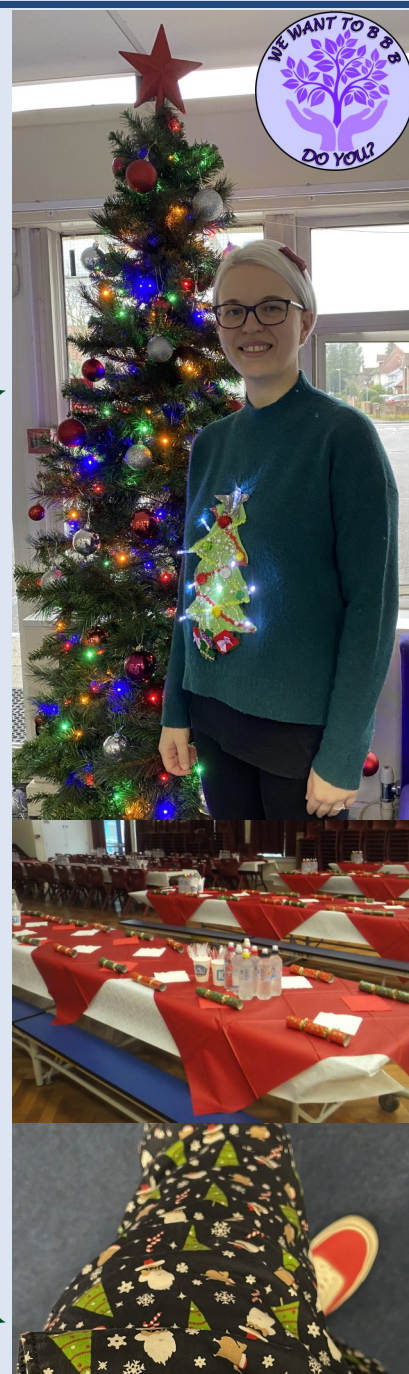

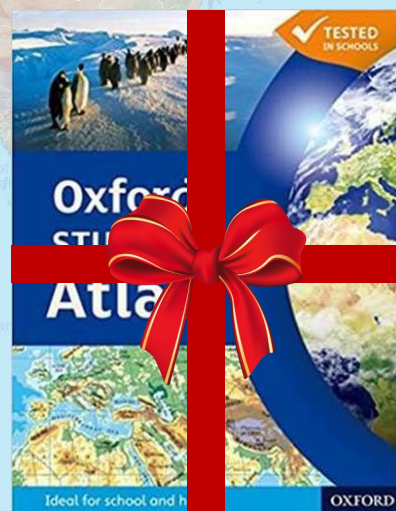
Each atlas will be inscribed with your name and a short message describing your favourite place in the world. The school will contact you for this information after your purchase.

Any and all donations are greatly appreciated by our students.

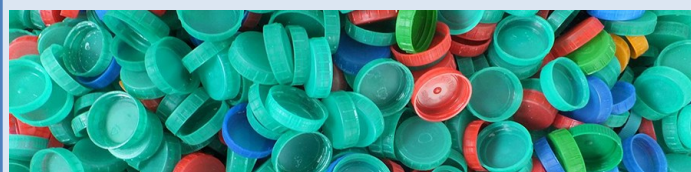


Milk Bottle Top Collection

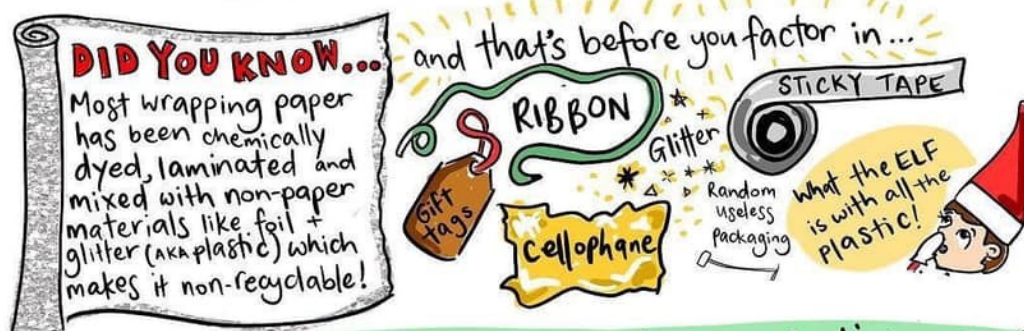
