Nothing New in 22



Here is a summary of a really inspiring zoom meeting I attended recently. Nothing New in 22 is a Facebook group with lots of tips on how to achieve the target of buying less and ideally nothing this year. Everyone can take part and choose their own level of challenge.

Nothing New in 22: Why we need to Reduce Consumption

Our decisions count. What we do makes a difference. Why do we want to reduce what we buy?
We are in a climate emergency. We are in an ecological emergency.

We need to reduce our carbon footprint to 2-3 tonnes per person each year in eight years time. We want to slow down consumption and become more mindful about what we are buying. Extending the life time of our clothes to nine months would reduce our carbon footprint by approximately 25%. Using our mobiles for one third longer would decrease our carbon omissions by as much as Ireland's total annual emissions.

Consumption is now the number one driver of environmental breakdown. Our stuff now weighs more than all the living things on the earth. Consumption had increased 60% in twenty years, driven by social media and FOMO. Earth overshoot day for the UK is in March, this means we have used all the resources that the planet can sustain in one year and the rest of the year we are taking the resources that our children and grandchildren will need. We can change this by reducing what we buy new and setting ourselves the challenge to reuse and repair and buy nothing new in 22. We can decide what we are going to buy second hand, fix or swap.

The benefits are that we gain new skills. We have the satisfaction of fixing something or finding something second hand. We can save significant amounts of money. We can learn how to mend at the Repair Café, held on the first Saturday of each month in the Pallant Centre in Havant. We can learn to slow down and appreciate what we have.

We can make presents, like Mrs Raistrick's wonderful fudge, grow some house plants or give experiences to make memories instead of waste.

You decide what you will not buy and what you will still need. There are lots of Freecycle and Freegle sites and buy/sell/swap sites on social media in addition to Gumtree and Ebay.

You cannot fail Nothing New in 22 because YOU decide what you are going to give up. Every time you buy less, you are investing in everyone's future. **Mrs Rason, Science**

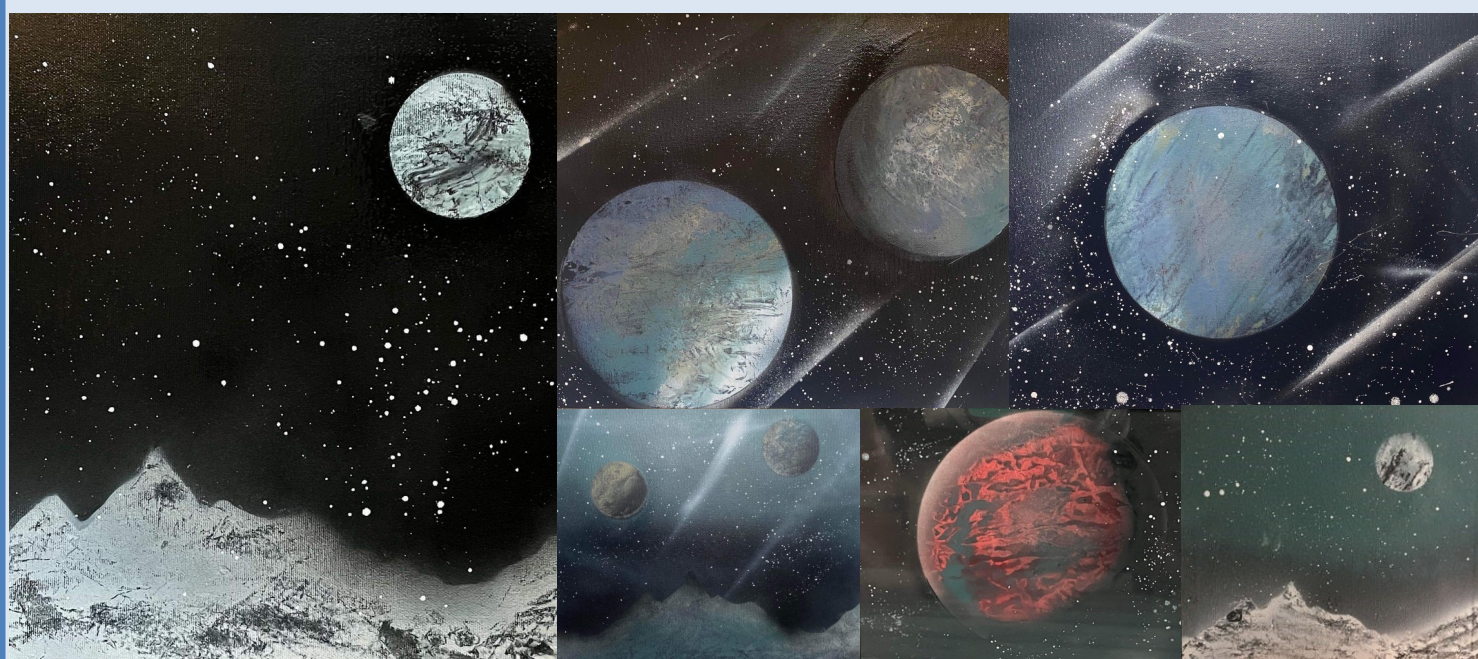
