Clean Air Day - Thursday 16th June

How good is the air we breathe? Not good enough according to the World Health Organisation and the UK Government.

Every year, air pollution causes up to 36,000 deaths in the UK. The World Health Organisation and the UK Government recognise that air pollution is the largest environmental health risk we face today.

Here's Why Clean Air Day Matters:

Children are particularly at risk from air pollution, as their immune system, lungs and brains are still developing. Air pollution can affect children's physical health, their ability to learn, and even lead to death. Yet millions of children are still exposed to dangerously high levels of air pollution, as over a quarter of UK schools are in areas above WHO air pollution limits.

Hampshire County Council Clean Air Project

Twelve of our students are taking part in Hampshire County Council Clean Air project. The aim is to raise awareness of air pollution that students experience in school and on the way to and from school. The students will identify locations to monitor air quality and use their findings to identify some of the solutions to reduce air pollution.

They will be measuring the pollution using an air monitor which measures levels of 4 main pollutants – PM 2.5, PM10, Nitrogen dioxide and Volatile organic compounds .
