We are very lucky as a school to have been granted the chance to borrow the meteorites and samples direct from the moon's surface which many people will have never seen up close before.




Above you can see some of meteorite samples. On the right is glass which was formed when a meteorite hit the earth and landed on sand, melting it into glass. As well as the samples, the kit was full of resources, instruments and maps allowing you to really get hands on and study these samples. The map of the moon allowed you to see where Apollo 11 landed next to the Sea of Tranquillity as well as other landmarks.


