




2. The Curriculum The Curriculum | Warblington School

3. Excellent Effort

Rewarding student effort is a key priority at Warblington School. Maximum effort leads to better outcomes and will be rewarded in a variety of ways. It's the night before the exam. Now you've done all that work it's time to give your brain a rest, so you're in tip top condition for sitting that exam. **Good luck!**




Weekly homework is set and can be viewed on classcharts. Some tasks can also be submitted via Classcharts. Students can also message their teachers via classcharts if they have any issues.




6. Accessing School emails (from anywhere!)

1. In any web browser (Edge, Chrome, Safari) go to <u>www.warblingtonschool.co.uk</u> and click on Email in the top right hand corner.



Learn all twenty(ish) physics equations.

8. Exams - Key Stage 4

Year 11

Year 11 PPEs (Pre-public exams) – 9th to 27th January 2023. These are a full set of exams, designed to replicate the exam season in the summer.

Whilst we await confirmation regarding how the summer series will be scheduled, communication regarding the timetable sent out via Weduc in December 2022

9. Attendance - Matters!

What to do if your child is absent?

In the case of a student who is unable to attend school, parents/carers are *expected to inform the school daily* as to why their child is absent. Warblington School has a dedicated telephone number for this purpose: 023 92 485159.

If the school does not receive a call on the morning of absence, the parents/carers will be texted by our Attendance Officer and informed that their child are not in school. The parent can then reply or call the school directly to discuss why their child is absent. This allows the school to make contact with the parents/carers at an early stage when their child is absent and also helps to alert parents/carers to the fact that their child may have unexpectedly not turned up for school.


Sit Together And Read (STAR)

- STAR takes place Monday to Thursday each week and provides students with 20 minutes to read for pleasure. Research states that reading for a minimum of 20 minutes per day improves GCSE grades.
- All students should have a reading book with them. A selection of suitable reading material and how to support your child is available to view on our website.
- Students take a reading test twice a year to establish their reading age. Students below ARE (age related expectation) are provided with small guided reading intervention sessions during STAR.
- Activities run throughout the year to promote reading and encourage literary discussions whilst improving reading fluency and understanding.





