It is completed online.





In Computing this week Year 10 have been looking at network design. Mr Chate, Computing




Year 7 Geography Posters

Year 7 Football Success!

Holocaust Survivor Talk

On Wednesday, the History Department arranged for a Holocaust survivor and his daughter to talk to a large group of Year 9, 10 and 11 students via video call. It started with technical issues but once sorted we met Harry Spiro and his daughter Tracy. Harry was born in Poland in 1929 to a poor family. His life changed in 1939 with the invasion of Poland by the Nazis.

Initially forced to live in a ghetto with other Jewish people from the community. He worked in a glass factory, this job saved his life. In 1942 the ghetto was liquidated and all members, aside from those who worked in the factory, were sent to Triblinka extermination camp where they were murdered. Harry lost his entire family. He lived in a small ghetto and worked in a munitions factory for a while before that too was liquidated and all inhabitants were sent to concentration camps.

Harry had his belongings, including a very sentimental letter from his mother, taken from him. His head was shaved bald and he was given a number, 116927. Hunger was the overriding feeling, he would grab any food anyway he could. At one point he was nearly shot for taking scraps from the pigs trough. As the Russians advanced he was moved further away, eventually having to take part in a death march. They had to walk and could not be left behind, those who rested too long would be shot. Of the 3,000 who started on the march only 300 survived. One of them was Harry.

Soviet soldiers liberated Theresienstadt at the end of the war. They were horrified by what they witnessed in the camps and gave the prisoners the opportunity to exact revenge on their captors. Harry said that he could not think of one example of a person taking them up on this offer, they were all just grateful to be free.

Harry came to live in Cumbria in 1945 as part of a charity mission to rehome Jewish victims of the holocaust. He trained as a tailor and in 1957 married Pauline, a woman who remained by his side. Harry had three children and now has a huge family of grandchildren and great grandchildren. At 96 years old, his main message was one of love and forgiveness.

At the end of Harry's talk the students were given the chance to ask questions. They asked thoughtful and respectful questions that showed their admiration for this brave man and his daughter. We were so proud of the students and the respect that they showed during this inspirational talk.
