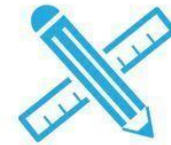


# 6. Homework & Revision

### Before you start, plan

We've all done it, spent so long revising the really tough stuff leaving no time for the remaining 90% of our revision. Plan, stick to it and don't panic!



### Be realistic

We'd all love to be Superman and get our revision done in 5 minutes but it isn't going to happen. Working 24 hours a day won't help either. Make sure your plan is manageable in the real world not Metropolis!



### The early bird...

Catches the worm, or at least has a sensible revision plan. The earlier you start, the less you'll have to do in each block.



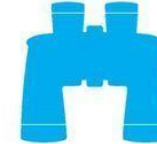
### A Room of One's Own

### Mix it up a bit

There are different ways of revising like there are different ways of memorising information. Rather than just copying out, try drawing diagrams, reading aloud, sticking it on post-its on the wall. Whatever helps!



### Look to the past

This doesn't involve a time machine, just checking out old exam papers. It can help you plan, revise, and calm you down!



### Take regular breaks!

Don't head for information overload. We're not designed to work flat-out and work far more efficiently if we take regular breaks. Try to get up and move around, have a dance if you want. Don't just close the book; make the most of that time off!



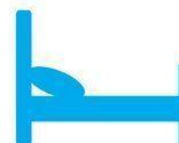
### Feed & water regularly

It's the night before the exam. Now you've done all that work it's time to give your brain a rest, so you're in tip-top condition for sitting that exam. **Good luck!**



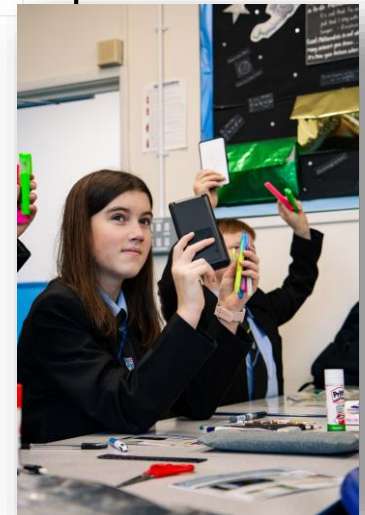

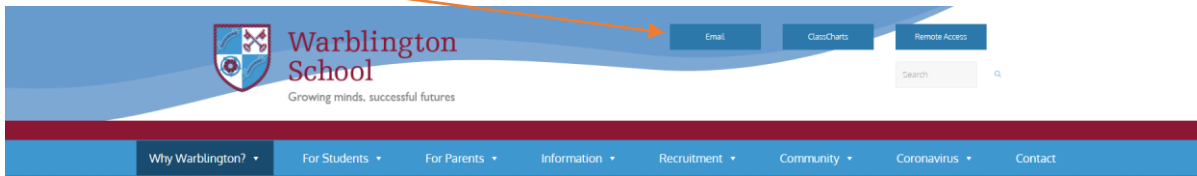

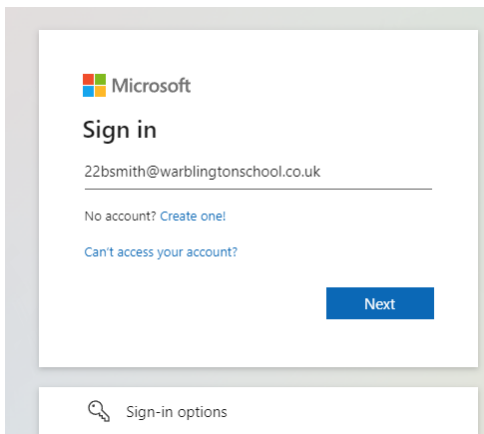
# 6. Accessing School emails (from anywhere!)

**NOTE:** Before accessing your student email for the first time you need to have logged into the school network and changed your network password from the default password.

1. In any web browser (Edge, Chrome, Safari) go to [www.warblingtonschool.co.uk](http://www.warblingtonschool.co.uk) and click on Email in the top right hand corner.

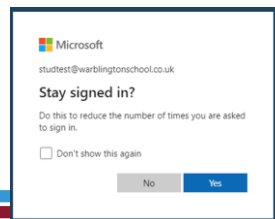


2. This should take you to a login page similar to the one below. Enter your student email address in the format [computerusername@warblingtonschool.co.uk](mailto:computerusername@warblingtonschool.co.uk) eg [22bsmith@warblingtonschool.co.uk](mailto:22bsmith@warblingtonschool.co.uk). The password is your normal School computer log-in password

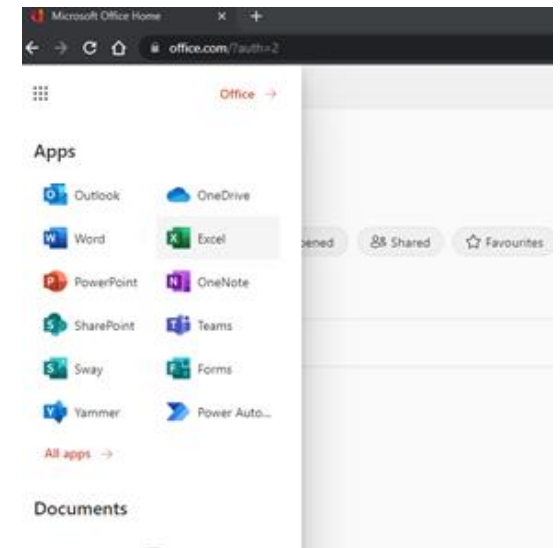


3. If you are not able to log in with a message stating your password is incorrect please connect the ICT Support Desk [icthelp@warblingtonschool.co.uk](mailto:icthelp@warblingtonschool.co.uk) or visit the IT office.

4. We would also recommend NOT to “Stay signed in” say no to this option to improve the security of your Student Email account.

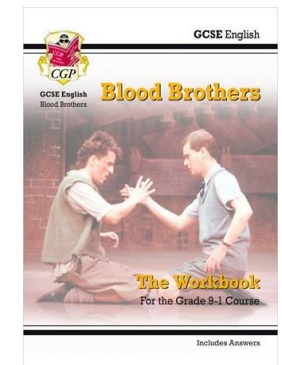
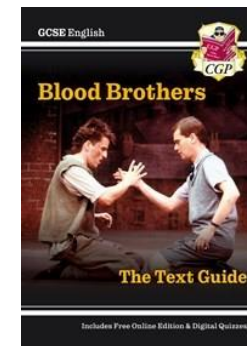
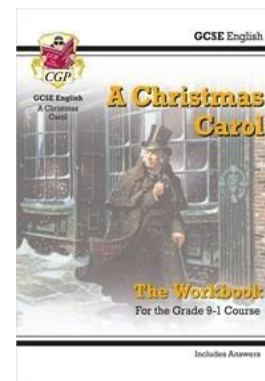
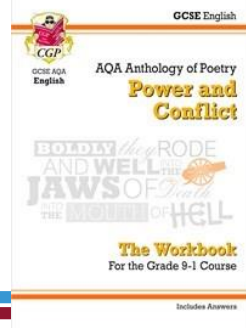
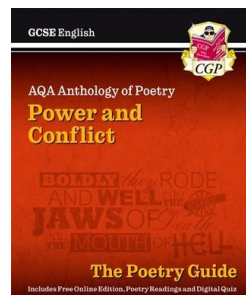
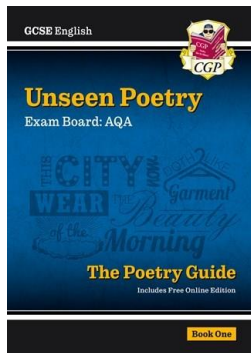
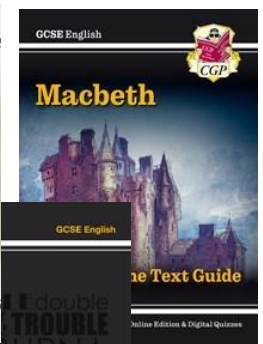
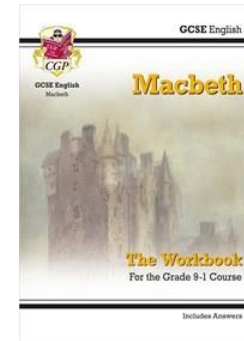
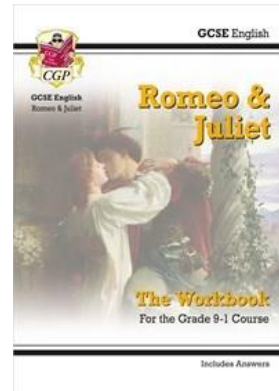
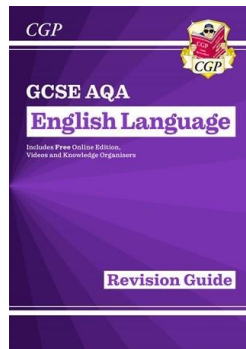
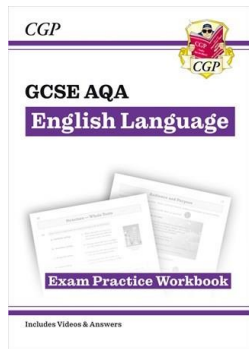
## Top Tips for Year 11 Success




# 9. Attendance – Matters!

## What to do if your child is absent?

In the case of a student who is unable to attend school, parents/carers are *expected to inform the school daily* as to why their child is absent. Warblington School has a dedicated telephone number for this purpose: 023 92 485159.

If the school does not receive a call on the morning of absence, the parents/carers will be texted by our Attendance Officer and informed that their child are not in school. The parent can then reply or call the school directly to discuss why their child is absent. This allows the school to make contact with the parents/carers at an early stage when their child is absent and also helps to alert parents/carers to the fact that their child may have unexpectedly not turned up for school.

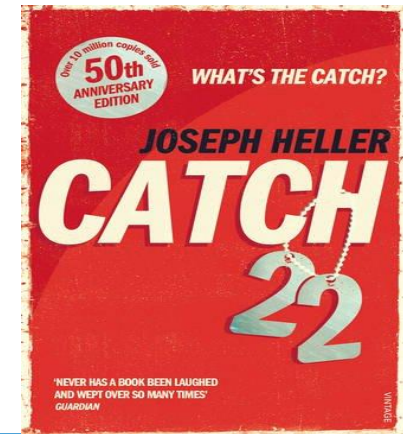
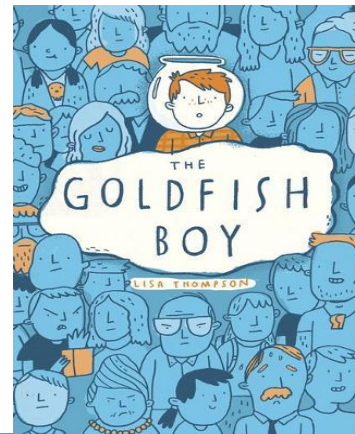
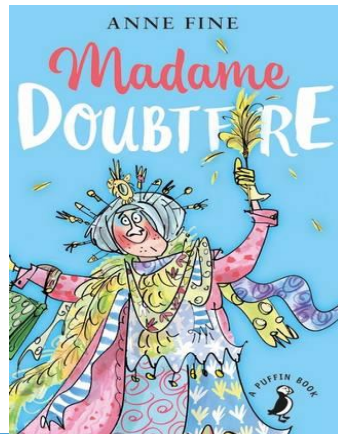
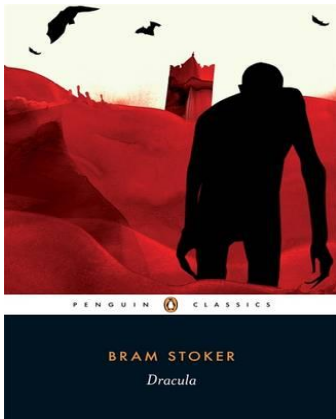
# Sit Together And Read (STAR)

- **STAR** takes place Monday to Thursday each week and provides students with 20 minutes to read for pleasure. Research states that reading for a minimum of 20 minutes per day improves GCSE grades.
- All students should have a reading book with them. A selection of suitable reading material and how to support your child is available to view on our website.
- Students take a reading test twice a year to establish their reading age. Students below ARE (age related expectation) are provided with small guided reading intervention sessions during STAR.
- Activities run throughout the year to promote reading and encourage literary discussions whilst improving reading fluency and understanding.

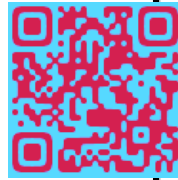
