Whilst we had purchased the show licence and scripts before the summer holidays, there have been issues with other performance aspects of the production and meeting the thresholds of a professional show licence.

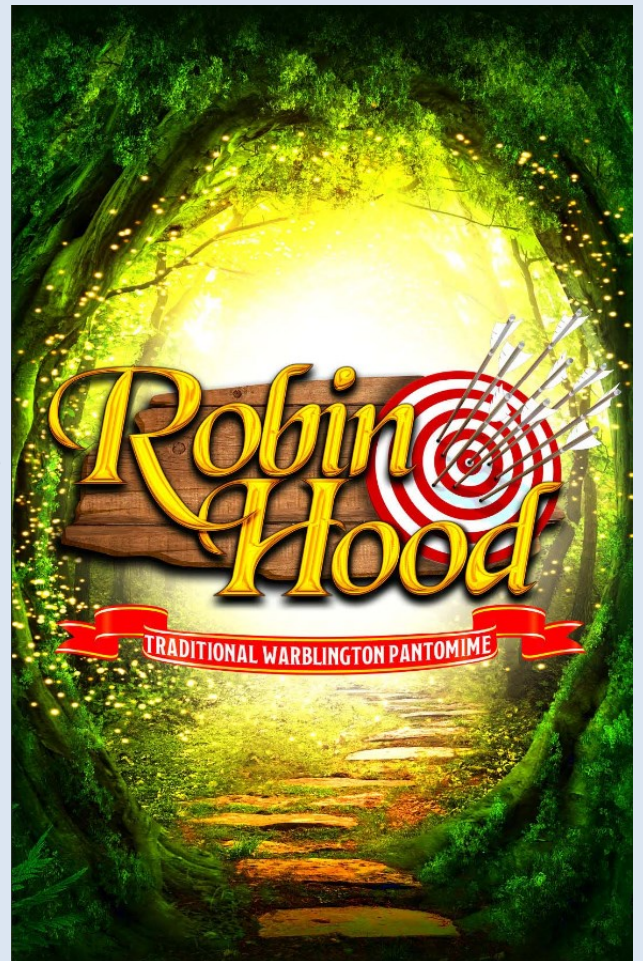
We have however started rehearsals for the NEW 2024 PRODUCTION OF ROBIN HOOD!

We borrowed the Moon!

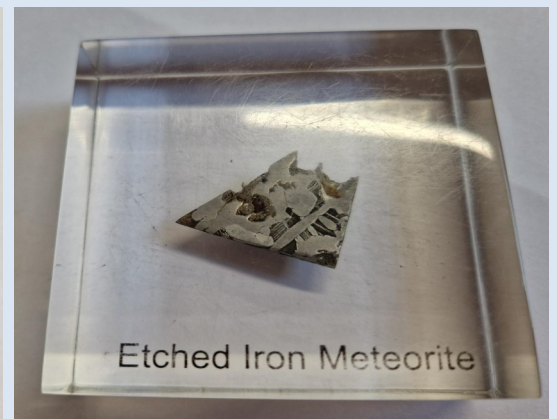
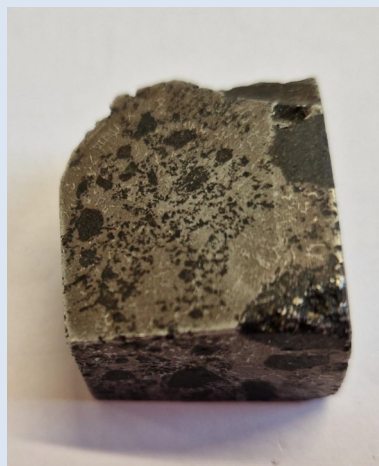
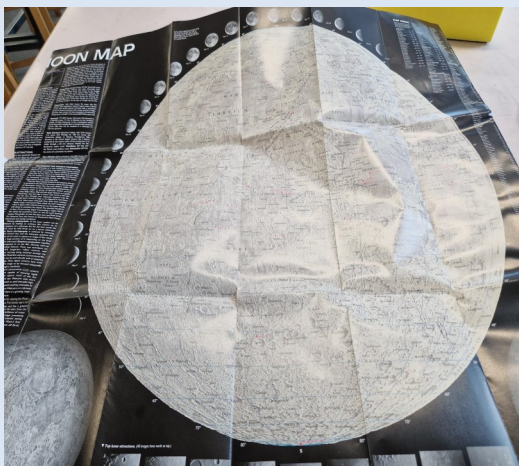
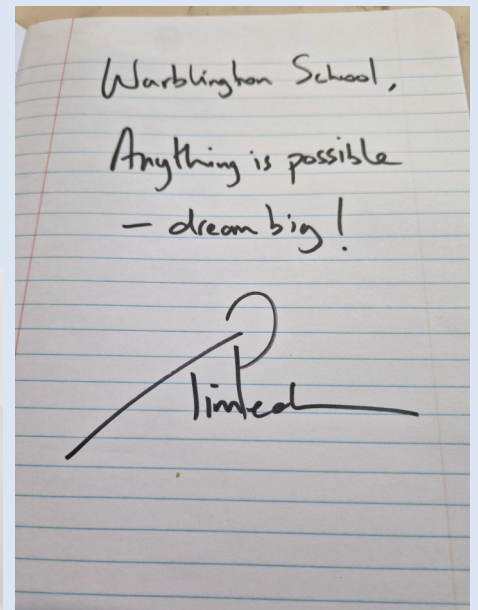
This week we have been lucky enough to have "borrowed the moon!"
