They first competed against Cowplain and despite Warblington's best efforts with Savannah working the goalkeeper several times, it was Cowplain who broke the deadlock. Savannah demonstrated resilience, responding well and being clinical to equalise. Cowplain did score again, however with excellent passing from Isabelle, Grace and Rosie; Shelby was able to snatch a last goal to secure a 2-2 draw. Savannah was nominated player of the match by her opponents. In the second fixture against Crookhorn, Bhakti and Lulu concentrated throughout the fixture in defence, allowing their team mates to be creative in the attacking half. Shelby and Savannah were again the scorers and Savannah being nominated player of the match again. I am incredibly proud of the group of year 9 students playing up in a year 10 league with only one student in the team today currently competing outside of school.











Year 10 Basketball Season Opener

Last week, the Year 10 basketball team opened their season with a doubleheader against Hayling College and Oaklands Catholic School. In the first game against Hayling, the team set out their intentions early, with some excellent fast breaks resulting in two-point scores. The ball movement was high-paced, causing imbalance in the Hayling defence, leading to Warblington being up by 11 at the halfway mark. Hayling came fighting back in the second period, with their centre particularly using his physicality and skill in order to bring Hayling closer to partity. Thankfully, it wasn't quite enough, with Warblington winning by 5 points at the end of the game.

The second game proved extremely tricky, with Oaklands fielding three national league players in their ranks. Undeterred, the team set about defending astutely, limiting scoring opportunities to mostly long-range efforts. Fast breaks proved once again to be a strength for the home team, with Kaynin K and Zac M particularly, using their pace and scoring ability to keep their team in touch. After a hard-fought game, Oaklands ended up taking the win 12-10. The team are looking forward to two more challenging games against Priory School and Crookhorn College this week.













Transition Reps Shine in Primary School Visits

Last week: Philip, Albie, Tillie, and Elsie have done a fantastic job as transition representatives over the past few months, supporting visits to 12 local primary and junior schools. They shared their experiences of starting secondary school, offering reassurance to Year 5 students by discussing their own worries and how they overcame them.

Dear Parents/Carers,

Re: Pupil Premium and Free School Meals

If your child is eligible for 'free school meals' and you register them for this, the school receives some additional funding called 'Pupil Premium'. We use this extra money to improve the educational provision and resources at the school.

What is Pupil Premium funding?

Pupil Premium funding from the government is given to schools to help students reach their full potential, regardless of their background or financial situation. It's provided for students who:

- Are registered for free school meals
- Have been registered for free school meals at any point in the past 6 years
- Are, or have been, in care

Is my child eligible for free school meals?

Your child might be eligible if you access:

- Income Support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on
- Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)






