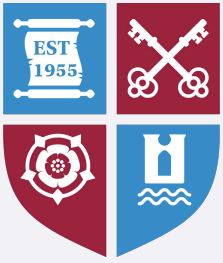

Bormio 2026 Begins!

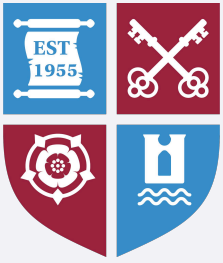
Bags packed,, and spirits sky-high, our Warblington School ski team has officially set off for Bormio!

Next stop: the mountains!





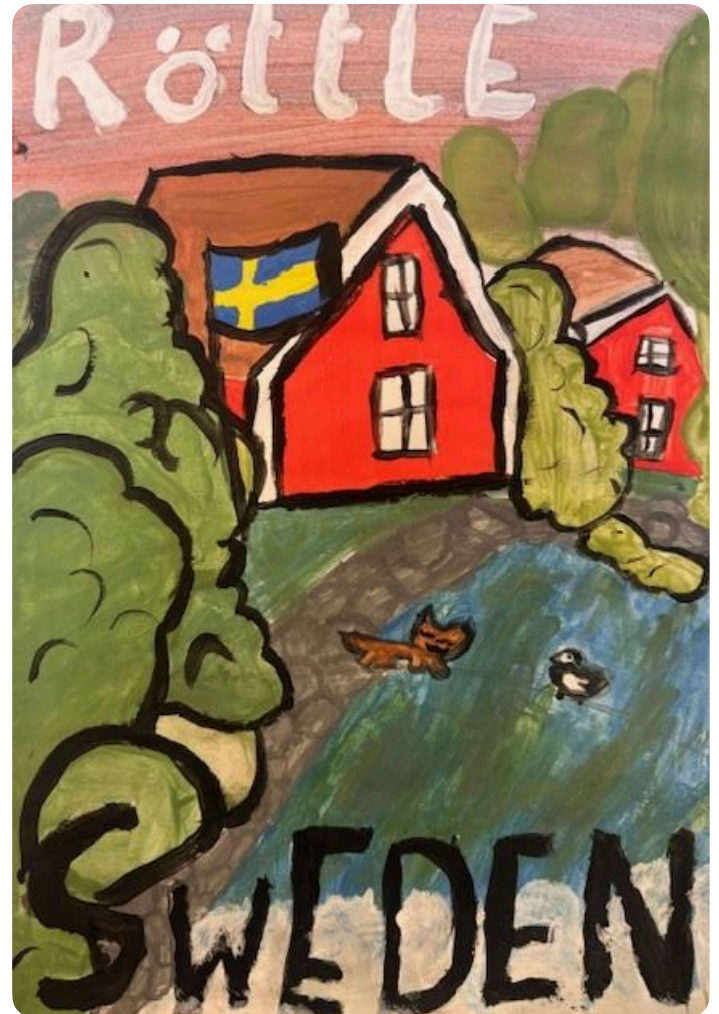
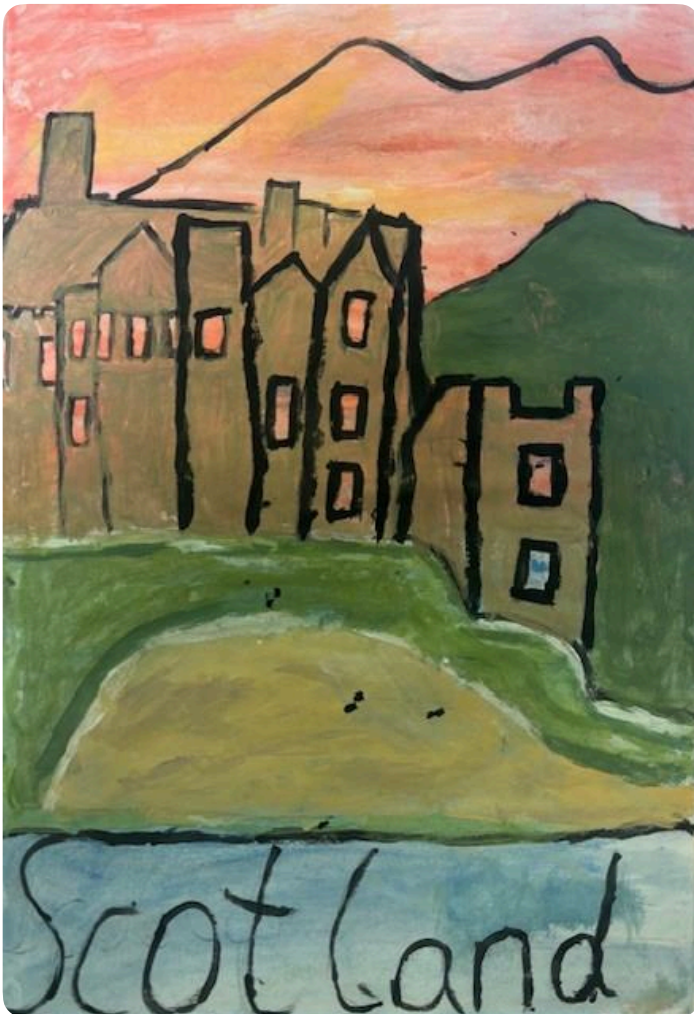

A student of ours, Mollie M, managed to take a photo next to the World Cup trophy in Havant on Monday. Brilliant stuff!



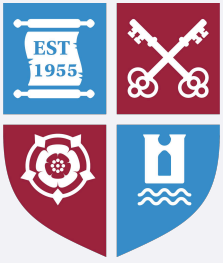

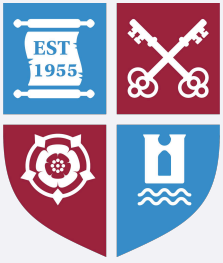

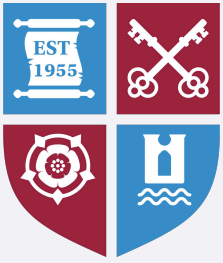

In attack, Erin put a great cross into the box and had 2 good attempts at goal while Kylie made good runs on the wing and scored a goal from tackling the ball after the opposition's goal kick, finishing the game 1-0 to Warblington.

The year 8s next game was against a strong year 8 HTC side, where Violet joined Kylie and Nevaeh with playing up for the year 8s, who all put 100% on the pitch by chasing down all loose balls. 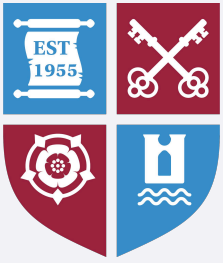

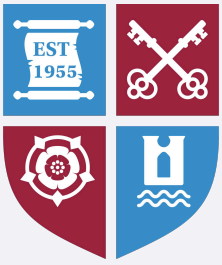
Girls Football Team
